During the length of employment, the entire time of the staff member will be at the disposal of the camp, according to the Staff Understandings, listed on the reverse side of this agreement.

The camp reserves the right to cancel this agreement in full or in part, in the event of: (a) unsatisfactory services; (b) for personal conduct not in accord with Scouting standards, or (c) should the attendance at camp make desirable the discontinuance of all or any part of the camp staff for all or any part of the camp

In the event it becomes necessary to cancel these arrangements for any part of the camp season for any of the reasons listed above, the staff member will be paid only for the proportionate part of the season he served, based on the total period compensation agreed to and stated above.

1. Time off will be scheduled at the discretion of the camp director, and in the best interest of the camp. With most personnel, this will be from Saturday noon until Sunday noon.
2. Every staff member will be expected to put in the time necessary to carry out his specific assignments and, in addition, be agreeable to accepting responsibility in the general conduct of the camp program. Camping is a twenty-four hour a-day proposition, and our responsibility for the health and welfare of the campers does not cease at any time during that period.
3. The first interest of every staff member is the boy. The camp exists and operates for him. In scouting, we deal through the scoutmaster and his troop leaders and the camp staff serves the scoutmaster, training him in skills, strengthening his leadership, and supporting him in his dealings with his scouts.
4. The staff member shall have at least two complete official scout summer uniforms. The camp director will determine when it will be worn.
5. A medical examination prior to arrival at camp is required. The forms will be provided by the Southwest Michigan Council. Staff members working with the food preparation must meet any special health requirements of the County or State Health Departments.
6. Staff members are covered by the State Workmen's Compensation Act with regard to accidental injury occurring "on the job," provided such injury is promptly reported. Expenses incurred as a result of an illness or any accident not connected with the job must personally be born by the staff member involved.
7. A staff member's personal conduct, both in and out of camp, which may interfere with camp morale or public opinion of scouting, renders him useless for further staff service. Adults who are accustomed to smoking may do so at places designated by the camp director. Smoking is not permitted by staff members under 18 years of age. The use of alcohol, beer, or wine at camp is strictly forbidden. Any staff member in possession of either will be immediately dismissed. Firearms and fireworks are also forbidden.
8. If, in the opinion of the Camp Director, the staff member's services are needed in another capacity, he may be given a change of assignment.
9. Staff members desiring to bring a car to camp must secure approval from the camp director in advance. A Certificate of Insurance must be filed with the camp director. The car must be parked in an assigned parking lot and left there while the staff member is in camp.
10. Staff members will plan to remain in camp up to 48 hours following the close of camp season to help close the camp. This will be determined in advance by the camp director.
11. Staff members will be expected to fulfill the entire time of this contract. Requests for departure before camp season is completed will not be granted.

INFORMATION: NATURE OF COMPLAINT: Reports a possible CSC.

INFORMATION: During investigation of complaints 46-3513-82, 1100-3, 46-3543-82, 1100-3 and 46-3641-82, 1100-1, information came forward that possible victim, [REDACTED] may also be a victim in above similar complaints. During that investigation, suspect, DAVID HARTER has been involved in incidences of CSC with several male youths. Information that investigation was taking place at the Boy Scouts of America Camp Ben Johnson, was brought forth on 7-30-82 by Camp Director, DAN CAULKETTE. CAULKETTE at that time stated that HARTER was being investigated within the Boy Scout organization for an alleged CSC incident which occurred at the camp. He stated that when the investigation was completed by the Boy Scouts that the matter would be turned over to an undetermined police agency. The Boy Scouts reluctantly have given information of other similar incidences. During the investigation of the above incidents, it was found that there may possibly be another victim which is yet to be confirmed. The name of that person is [REDACTED]

POSSIBLE VICTIM: [REDACTED] Road, Coldwater, MI, TX 238-2438.

TIME/VENUE: The incident allegedly occurred in Kalamazoo County, Ross Township, 6200 N. 39th Street, Augusta, MI, the location being Camp Ben Johnson. A camp owned and operated by the Boy Scouts of America. The incident allegedly occurred between a time period of 7-7-82 through 7-09-82.

SUSPECT: DAVID ORUS HARTER, w/m, dob 5-09-44, address of [REDACTED] Battle Creek, MI, 964-6991. Suspect is currently unemployed. He resides [REDACTED]

 with his wife and two children and is associated with the Boy Scouts organization as a Cub Master in the Lamora Park area of Battle Creek.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION SECTION:
 A check was made through the files for any record of the suspect and any prior CSC complaints. They advised the only record was on a complaint from this post, 46-823-67.

RECORD BUREAU:
 Contact was made with the microfilm section of the record bureau for a copy of 46-823-67. They advised that a copy was on file and would be forwarded.

SEARCH:
 A hand search of the files shows the only entry as the complaint filed by this Post. The charge is contributing to the delinquency of a minor. The final disposition was a fine of \$10.00 and six months on probation.

46-823-67:
 The complaint states that the suspect, HARTER, was involved on two occasions with a 14 yr. old boy and a CSC. HARTER was a photographer and took pictures of the victim naked and had sexual contact with the boy. He also took pictures of the boy and himself naked in the photos. HARTER admitted that the allegations were true in this complaint. He allegedly told the victim at that time that he was a homosexual.

INTERVIEW DANIEL CAULKETTE:
 CAULKETTE was interviewed on 8-11-82 at the office of the Boy Scouts of America, S.W. Michigan Counsel at 1919 Sterns Road, Kalamazoo, MI. He stated he was the Director of the camp which opened 7-05-82 and closed 7-31-82. He stated the first contact with HARTER was during Camp season of 1981 when HARTER was the leader of the Weebelo Group. During that time they were involved in starting up a new scouting activity for rangers, a grade of cub scout. HARTER contacted the CAULKETTE during the 1981 season stating that he had some ideas for an expanded Rangers program and would like to volunteer his services to run the program during the summer of 1982. CAULKETTE stated that since HARTER was willing to volunteer his services and that he came highly recommended from the Battle Creek Branch of the Boy Scouts, that he allowed HARTER to head the program. HARTER was allowed to supplement himself by taking photographs of Scouts at the camp where he received .50¢ profit on each picture that he sold. He advised that HARTER requested that he be allowed to stay in an old run down trailer which was on the camp property. He stated that the trailer would be ideal to set up a dark room for his photos plus it was away from the crowd to allow him to get his work done. At this time it was agreed to by CAULKETTE. CAULKETTE stated the first time he was aware HARTER was a suspect in a CSC was on 7-19-82 when he first received a call from HUGH GUSHIKEN who was a leader of a boy scout group who was out at the camp on 7-17-82, 7-18-82 and 7-19-82. A meeting was set up for the morning of 7-20-82 between CAULKETTE, GUSHIKEN, the victim, her mother and her fiance. During that meeting it was found that the victim who was 10 yrs. old had been approached by HARTER on the above three dates. On the first night HARTER entered the tent of the youth who he had shared with another and began tickling the youth. HARTER then pulled back the covers and tickled his body but did not touch his genital region. The following evening HARTER again returned and pulled back the covers and

began tickling the youth and then pulled down his underpants and began pulling at the youths penis. When the youths penis became erect, HARTER then put it in his mouth and began sucking on it. The youth told CAULKETTE that he was scared and only went along with it as he was scared for his own well being. HARTER allegedly asked the youth several times if he trusted him. HARTER then asked the youth to suck on his penis as he then pulled down his own pants. The youth refused to stating that he was too tired. On 7-19-82 when the same youth was finished taking a shower and was wiping himself off, HARTER came in to the room and began pulling on the youths penis. After hearing the evidence at this meeting, CAULKETTE told the victims mother that an investigation would be made in to the matter. He stated HARTER would not be questioned until the Camp let out and that he would be approached at that time. He then contacted his supervisor, CHARLES SPEICHER, who then contacted their local lawyer as well as the National Headquarters of the Boy Scouts. It was the decision of their lawyers that being that there was no proofs that they didnt want to damage the reputation of the Boy Scouts or HARTER, they decided they would wait until the Camp let out for the summer before approaching him. A decision was made to closely monitor the activities of HARTER. CAULKETTE stated he had told the original victims mother that HARTER would be approached upon completion of the camp. He stated that he had been advised by his supervisors and legal counsel that he should neutralize the situation and keep it quiet. Since the incidents occurred, the Boy Scouts organization has had no contact with the suspect.

INTERVIEW HUGH GUSHIKEN:

On 8-12-82 GUSHIKEN of [REDACTED], Marshall, MI, home TX [REDACTED] work [REDACTED] was interviewed at the Post. He is the Scout Leader of Troop # 373 which was at Camp Ben Johnson during the period of July 16, 17 and 18, 1982. It was GUSHIKEN who first approached the Boy Scouts reference complaint 46-3543-82, 1100-3 file class. GUSHIKEN states he had quite a bit of contact with HARTER while at the Camp as HARTER was in charge of the Rangers program. HARTER was assisting them while there for the three day camp. He states that now that after the facts are known that some of the things which HARTER said at the Camp had different meanings. GUSHIKEN states that it was obvious that HARTER was making special efforts and attentions toward the victim on 46-3543-82. Several times HARTER would say that he really liked the boy and further that he was his kind of guy. Also stated several times that he would like to take him home with him. On several occasions HARTER would grasp the victim in a bear hug. GUSHIKEN stated that the hug was a caressing type of hug, one of endearment. He also stated that it was obvious that HARTER showed a lot of favors on the victim and it was evident that he was his favorite. GUSHIKEN at the time thought this was a normal gesture and that being that the victim did not have a father possibly because of this HARTER was paying special attention. However, he states now that he knows that HARTER has been involved in CSC incidents, that the incidents presently hold a different meaning to him. GUSHIKEN stated that with his contact with HARTER at the Camp, HARTER seemed to be almost obsessed with a story he kept telling about a youth who had been at the camp earlier in the season who he had found lying naked in his sleeping bag.

VIEW HUGH GUSHIKEN:

Again at the time GUSHIKEN did not think much of the matter until the activities at the camp have come out in to the open. GUSHIKEN states that the only facts he knows about the boy was that he was approximately 11-12 yrs. old and was after the attendants at the Camp Ben Johnson was believed to be going to [REDACTED] in Indiana.

INTERVIEW [REDACTED]:

[REDACTED] the victim of 46-3641-82, 1100-1 file class was interviewed on 8-17-82. At that time [REDACTED] advised that he also was a victim of HARTER. Further that he had been hired as HARTER's assistance for the summer months as HARTER was going to be taking photographs at several Boy Scout Camps during the summer. [REDACTED] who is 12 yrs. of age stated that his first sexual contact from HARTER occurred at the Camp Ben Johnson in Augusta. [REDACTED] advised that the CSC involved mutual masturbation and attempted fellatio on the part of HARTER. [REDACTED] also states that during a period which he believed to be the July 7, 8, 9, 1982 which would have been the first Weebelo group which arrived at Camp Ben Johnson that he had further knowledge of a possible victim. He stated that the boy blonde haired approximately 11 yrs. of age was with pack 306. He further stated he did not believe that the boy was a member of the pack but further was camping with them and possibly may have been an assistant to the Scout leader. He stated that he believed the leader of the group had a first name which possibly may have been [REDACTED]. On the second day of the camp, which would have July 8, 1982 he walked in to the trailer and saw HARTER and this boy sitting next to each other on the bed talking. He stated that first HARTER had told him that nothing had occurred between him and the boy, however, later he confessed that he and the boy had had mutual masturbation and further that the two had done fellatio to each other. [REDACTED] stated that HARTER had told him that he liked the boy very much. He also stated that HARTER who was the photographer at the camp had asked [REDACTED] to pose naked for several photo sessions to which he refused.

INTERVIEW ROGER BARNETT:

BARNETT the assistant scout leader of Troop 306 resides at [REDACTED] in Battle Creek, MI, TX 963-8940. BARNETT stated that he brought his group of boys to the first Weebelo session, that being July 7, 8, and 9th, 1982. Further stated that he vaguely recalls there being a blonde haired boy approximately 11 yrs. of age. It appeared during the interview with BARNETT he was being very vague and not very cooperative during the interview. He would not volunteer any information. ONLY would answer the questions briefly as they were asked by Undersigned. He did state he had a group photo of the boys that he tookd with him for that session and could picture the boy who undersigned was describing. He stated conferring with his son and looking at the names at the back of the photo, he was able to determine that the boys name was [REDACTED]. He was asked if he had recalled any unusual activities or special fondness that was observed between HARTER and [REDACTED] to which he stated he did not recall any such incidences. He did state that he was the assistant pack leader and he was there assisting HARTER and that the opportunity could have taken place.

 contacted reference information thus far collected reference a possible victim, [redacted]. He advised that he would look through the records and possibly advise of an address and phone number for the victim. He did come up with a home address and phone number for [redacted] which is noted earlier in this complaint.

RELATED COMPLAINTS:
 As mentioned earlier this Post has open status three complaints of CSC involving the suspect, HARTER, had Camp Ben Johnson, Kalamazoo County. The three complaints involve the suspect HARTER masturbating the youths and further asking the youths to reciprocate. Also involved in the incidences are one case of fellatio and one of an attempted fellatio.

INTERVIEW DAVID HARTER:
 Suspect DAVID HARTER was interviewed on 8 17-82 at the State Police Post in Battle Creek. He was advised of his rights via the State Police preinterview advice of rights card. He stated that he did understand his rights and would talk to Undersigned. At this time he was advised of the allegations against him. He denied any involvement, stating he had neither the time nor the opportunity to have contact with the victims. When confronted of his arrest for CSC in 1967, he admitted that he did commit the CSC with the boy but the only reason that it occurred was so that he could get out of going in to the army. During the interview he acknowledged that the boys of the age group involved would not make up stories of such a nature. The interview took place for approximately 45 minutes with HARTER continuing to deny his involvement. [REDACTED] stated that upon arriving the at the Camp HARTER began to show the group [REDACTED] was with how to put up a tent immediately after arrival. The group then went to Dinner and HARTER was present with the group at this time. After Dinner the group accompanied by the Senior Patrol Leader "MIKE" and HARTER went to the Trading Post. After the store activities, MIKE and [REDACTED] went for firewood followed by group activities during which time HARTER approached [REDACTED] acouple of times. [REDACTED] did not know what conversation took place between [REDACTED] & HARTER.

Following the group activities, the group proceeded to the Fire-Bowl at which time DAN CAULKETTE informed the group about the next days upcoming activity plans. When the fire-bowl was approximately half over, HARTER arrived and sat next to the Den Dads i.e., [REDACTED]. After the fire-bowl HARTER lead the group on a night hike and upon arriving back at the tent site, HARTER told to group get ready for bed.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went inside the tent, got ready for bed putting on pj's and then went to bed. [REDACTED] stated that he was sleeping inside a sleeping bag and [REDACTED] was using blankets. At approximately 11:00pm [REDACTED] knew this time because lights out was at 10:30pm and the group got back from the night hike about 10:45pm and he got ready for bed and right afterwards HARTER came in) HARTER came into [REDACTED] & [REDACTED] tent and went over to [REDACTED] and started tickling [REDACTED] followed by HARTER then going over to [REDACTED] and tickling [REDACTED]. HARTER after tickling [REDACTED] came back to [REDACTED] who was pretending to be asleep because he wanted to get to sleep and not to be tickled. HARTER pulled down [REDACTED] sleeping bag followed by pulling down [REDACTED] PJ's bottoms. [REDACTED] stated that HARTER said during this time, for [REDACTED] not to say anything to anyone about this or [REDACTED] would get hurt and that something like this would probly happen to him if he went to [REDACTED] anyway (The group obtained information during the day about the academy and [REDACTED] expressed an interest about the school).

[REDACTED] told HARTER to cut it out and attempted to squirm away but when tried to get away HARTER held him down by placing his right hand on [REDACTED] left shoulder. During this time HARTER was fondling [REDACTED] penis which became erect and then began to masturbate [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that he couldn't get away from HARTER because HARTER was to strong. During this time HARTER would look out the tent entrance to see if anyone was nearby and [REDACTED] again attempted to get away only to be forced down. During a period when HARTER looked out the tent, HARTER observed [REDACTED] outside the tent and after [REDACTED] entered his own tent HARTER stated "Remember what I said!" refering to the threat. HARTER then left the tent.

[REDACTED] felt that [REDACTED] may have been asleep during the act, however, he was unsure and scared of HARTER and what might happen.

[redacted] told HARTER to cut it out and attempted to squirm away but HARTER held him down by placing his right hand on [redacted]' left shoulder. During this time HARTER was fondling [redacted] penis which became erect, and then began to masturbate him. [redacted] stated that he couldn't get away from HARTER, as [redacted] was too strong. David Harter has been charged with four counts of second degree criminal sexual conduct and one count of first degree criminal sexual conduct. The criminal case is to be tried in the near future. He was arrested and fined by a Justice of the Peace in 1967 for molesting and pornographic photography.

Although we have not been notified by an attorney, it appears a civil suit is developing in which the Boy Scouts of America will become involved.

I am sending to you a copy of all the materials we have gathered concerning the happenings during our Cub Scout Day Camp and Webelos camping season this past summer.

Charles Speicher, who was our Scout Executive until November, is now Scout Executive in Lexington, Kentucky. Dan Caulkett, who was director of the Cub Scout Day Camp, is still on our staff. Charles Johnson is our Program Director.

If we can be of further assistance, please let us know.

place from the time I became involved
to the time I informed the Scout office.

On the evening of, July ~~20th~~^{19th}, Mr. Hugh
Bushiken call me at my home. He told me about
an accusation of child molesting. The charges
came from [REDACTED] the
mother of [REDACTED] a volunteer camp
staff member, David Hurter.

Mr. Bushiken was a Webelos Scout leader
who brought [REDACTED] and several other Scouts
out for a three day Webelos Scout camp program.
The camp opened on the morning of July 17th
and ran through the evening of July 19th. Mr. Bushiken
and his group of Webelos were assigned, by me
to the Ranger's Club Troop in a camp site
called Little Mesa.

Dave Hartier's position with the Cub Scout Camp program was one of volunteer. He volunteered his time this summer in two main areas. First, he presented to me this past winter a program in which he offered to run with very little cost to the camp program or himself. The program was an expansion of a program introduced last year. It was called "The Ranger's Club."

The Rangers club is an advanced webelos camp program designed for those webelos Scouts that has earned all the badges offered at camp.

I was very impressed with Dave's written program, his willingness to run the program, and the recommendation about Dave by the Battle Creek Scout office.

In addition to the Ranger's club, Dave also offer to take group pictures. He would take pictures each morning for any group upon request and would then have 8" by 10"

pictures ready by the afternoon. These two programs were a great addition to the 1982 programs.

The proceeding that took place after the evening phone call to me from Hugh Gashiken on Monday July 19th 1982 were as follows:

Tuesday July 20th 10:00 am - I met with Hugh Gashiken, [redacted], and her boy friend [redacted]. We met at the Speed's Restaurant on Dickman Road. There we discussed the accusation's that Dave Harter had sexually molested [redacted].

After the meeting I stopped by Bob Chockley's, District Executive for the Battle Creek area. There we called Mr. Charles Speicher Council Executive.

Mr. Speicher, then met me at Camp Ben Johnston around 3:00 pm. This was after he had called the regional and national offices for what procedures should be followed. The office instructed me to request written statements by the boy, [redacted] and his mother [redacted] and myself.

During dinner that evening around 6:30 I called Hugh Bushiken and later that evening I called [redacted] to request the statements.

The statements were turned into me on Monday evening July 26th and I turned them into Mr. Speicher on Thursday July 29th.

Portage calls for talks about wastewater rates

Portage officials will try talking to resolve an impasse with the city of Kalamazoo over a wastewater treatment contract and rates.

The City Council voted unanimously Tuesday to have City Manager Donald Ziemke, consultant Raymond Smit and the city legal staff discuss "upgrading" its contract with Kalamazoo.

The Kalamazoo City Commission last week approved on first reading a proposed 48 percent increase in wastewater treatment rates.

Portage and Kalamazoo have locked horns for two years over the validity of a 1967 contract and a contract proposed in 1980 by Kalamazoo. Portage contends the prior 40-year pact is still in effect.

Portage paid \$190 per million gallons from 1967 to 1979, \$414 pmg from November 1979 to Jan. 1, 1981, and compromised at \$700 pmg in February 1981 after being asked to pay \$946 pmg under the new contract. Portage voided that compromise in February this year and said it would pay \$528 pmg.

Kalamazoo is asking an increase to \$1,400 pmg.

"I think we have a valid contract but we may need to update it," said Mayor Pro Tem Kurt Stern.

City Attorney John Peters said Portage could protest the proposed increase but, "There is nothing

you can do about what they do to their own citizens. It's their fees and their system. They can do what they want."

Some council members said they don't want to jeopardize their legal position by agreeing to change the current contract or accepting the proposed rates.

Stern said the city should make it clear that there are "discrepancies" in the 1967 contract but that Portage would not suggest "starting with a new contract."

Councilman Thomas Bieberte said, "It may be wise to scratch the old contract and start with a new contract. I think we are spinning our wheels."

In other action, the James Morren Co. has been given the go-ahead to convert the former Lexington Green Elementary School into offices.

After a public hearing in which no objections were voiced, the council approved a request to rezone the property from one-family residential to office service.

Some residents previously told the council and planning commission that rezoning would damage the residential nature of the neighborhood and increase traffic.

Left unchanged was a parcel abutting the property to prevent Morren traffic from using Cheshire or Winthrop residential streets.

I was woken up by [redacted]. They informed me that their daughter [redacted] told them that she had been sexually abused by a young counselor in Trinidad by the name of [redacted].

The [redacted] came to camp sometime between July 15 - 18th. [redacted] is a friend of our camp cook, Mrs [redacted]. [redacted] asked [redacted] to come out to camp and help her with the cooking. [redacted] agreed to volunteer as long as she could have her family stay. This included her husband, [redacted] and [redacted] 6 years old.

[redacted] is a twelve year old scout from Battle Creek. [redacted] is

a member of the Scout Troop that
Mr. David Harter is associated
Dave introduced me to [REDACTED] in
May and ask if he could spend

When I got up to the health
lodge, [redacted] was in one room calling
his parents while I talk to

The [redacted] They decided to take [redacted] in to a Battle Creek hospital to be checked over. They left and [redacted] came out of the other room. We all decided that [redacted] should pack his things and leave tonight. I explained that by leaving it was not an admission of guilt but I was sending him home to try to defuss the situation.

At about 2⁰⁰ am [redacted] mom and Dad arrived and took [redacted] home. I believe it is important to mention that [redacted] said he did not do it and his parents also did not believe that he did either.

At 4⁰⁰ am ~~the~~ two State police officers from the Battle Creek Post stopped by my cabin and talk to me. Afterwards they went up to

the trailer ~~and~~ talked to Gene Hunter
and look around.

The [REDACTED] left in the afternoon
the next day. During the next day,
the 30th I called Mr Speicher.

The only other thing that I have done
is to discuss the situation with the entire
staff just before we closed camp at
