Last year, as you will recall, I talked to you about a Webelos Leader that was being brought up on Child Molestation charges. You indicated at that point that he should resign his position, effective immediately. He concurred and followed our mandate.

This morning, Leonard LaGrave approached me to indicate that he was acquitted of all charges by the State of Rhode Island. (Judgements of Acquittal are enclosed) He also expressed an interest in returning to Scouting as a volunteer leader. The unit that he was associated with, Pack 28 Pawtucket, would not approve his application. They indicated to him that it was too great a risk to allow him to return and work with the boys, even though he was acquitted. I supported their position by informing Mr. LaGrave that it is the responsibility of the sponsoring institution to approve all adult leaders in their unit.

As the discussion continued, it was clear that he would now seek a position in any other area unit. He asked that if I heard of an opening, would I give him a call.

Following this discussion, I called Fr. Allard of St. Cecilia's in Pawtucket. Fr. Allard expressed his view that neither he nor the unit leaders wanted to take the risk of allowing Mr. LaGrave to rejoin Scouting, especially since this was not his first indictment

This morning, when you called our Regional Office, Mr. Flythe indicated that the risk was too great on our end as well. It is now our position that Leonard LaGrave should no longer be allowed to serve as a volunteer leader in the Boy Scouts of America. Should he wish to appeal this decision, he may do so in writing to Council President, Jules Cohen.


