Chronology:

11/10/90: An interested Scouter called informing me of the arrests of Donald Manning, Sr., Roberta Manning and Randy Lucas on alleged sexual misconduct charges.

11/11/90: Scoutmaster of Troop 31 called advising me of basically the same story.

11/12/90: I called a Council Executive Board Member in Garrett County to find out what he had heard. He shared the additional information that the alleged victim was receiving care.

11/12/90: I called Scott Murray, Chairman of the Potomac Council's Youth Protection Committee, -- recounting what I knew.

11/14/90: The SM of Troop 31 called, said that Rick Kutchman of the Garrett County Protective Services called asking for permission to come to Troop 31's meeting that night to interview the other boys. We encouraged him to do so.

11/14/90: Father Feild called and reported that he was present at the troop meeting - that Rick Kutchman did his interview and told Father Feild that he didn't see any involvement by any of the other boys.

11/15/90: Article on arrests published in Cumberland Times

Thursday - 11/15/90: Article on arrests published in Cumberland Times

Thursday - 11/15/90: Rick Kutchman called me and confirmed that he had indeed interviewed each boy in the troop and felt, that in his opinion no one else was involved outside of the Mannings and Lucas.

Friday - 11/16/90: Youth Protection Crisis Management Committee met and reviewed all information from past week. Recommendations coming from meeting included:

- (1) Sending certified letters to Randy Lucas & Donald Manning revoking their registration in the Boy Scouts of America. (receipt required)
- (2) To look into the possibility of meeting with the boys, parents and adult leaders in the troop about the situation but after the case was closed.

Friday - 2/8/91 : Pat Reed, District Aide, called to inform me that the trials for Randy Lucas & Roberta Manning had begun and a front page article in the Republican regarding the trial had mentioned that some of the incidents between one of the adults and the victim had occurred at Scout meetings. She said that many concerned parents and leaders had called. We agreed that an open meeting for all concerned should be held as soon as possible.

Friday - 2/8/91 : I called Scout Murray to inform him of the new circumstances and he agreed that a meeting on Feb. 18 would be appropriate.

Tuesday - 2/12/91 : Talked with Rick Kutchman of Protective Services to see if anything new had occurred since his investigation and he said no. He went on to reiterate that "the investi-

if anything new had occurred since his investigation and he said no. He went on to reiterate that "the investigation was conducted with full cooperation of the Scouting organization and that he was sure that there was no

organization and that he was sure that there was no

involvement outside of the 3 adults and the single victim.

Tuesday - 2/12/91 : I called Mary McEwan at the Republican to express our concern with the article and to share with her the fact that a meeting was scheduled. We encouraged newspaper participation at the meeting. She said she would put

an article in the paper regarding the meeting.

Tuesday - 2/12/91 : I called the former state's attorney from Allegany
County asking him how the newspaper knew what it knew.

He said that probably from papers filed at the clerks office. I also asked him if it would be possible to get some details from the assistant State's Attorney from Garrett County regarding the case. He said he would

call her.

Tuesday - 2/12/91 : Bob Hamilton called back, said he had talked with Lisa

Thayer (Ass't States Attorney) and that she was willing

to talk with me.

Tuesday - 2/12/91 : Called Lisa Thayer (Ass't State's Attorney) told her

about the concern of the parents and leaders. She said that in her opinion she considered the case to involve two families rather than Scouting. She went on to say that "the contact of the victim & the

adults involved was initiated outside of Scouts."

2/18/91: Held open meeting at Garrett Community College with about 50 Scouters and parents. Council President, James S.

Bryner, Crisis Management Chairman Scott Murray and Scout Executive Brad Burr chaired the meeting. No press

attended although they were invited.

Agenda included:

- (1) Why we are here including:
 - (a) Deal with facts
 - (b) Allay questions
 - (c) Answer questions
 - (d) To not let the success of Scouting be damaged by the unacceptable behavior of a few
- (2) Complete chronology of the case
- (3) Open forum Questions, Comments, etc. etc.

The meeting aired a great deal. One of the investigating police officers was there and supported vigorously the contention that this was not Scout related. Ended on a very positive note.

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FOR RELEASE UPON INQUIRY BY MEDIA

Everyone involved in Scouting throughout the Potomac Council service area is very concerned about the incident in Oakland. The adults involved were registered Scouters, although their membership now has been revoked.

The Potomac Council consists of three districts --- Nemacolin, which basically is Allegany County; Tri-Valley, which encompasses the West Virginia Counties of Mineral, Hampshire, Grant and Hardy, and Deep Creek. The city of Oakland and Garrett County are in the Deep Creek District.

The Potomac Council leadership is cooperating fully with the agencies investigating the charges. Boy Scouts of America has been and will continue to be actively involved in attacking the problem of child abuse.



Lucas Receives Five Years For Sex Offense

Randy R. Lucas, 20, Oakland, was sentenced to five years in the Maryland Department of Corrections on the charge of second degree sex offense. Judge Fred A. Thayer of the Garrett County Circuit Court handed down the sentence last Thursday.

Lucas was charged with the offense last fall after he sexually abused a teenager, according to the court record. The abuse to the 14year-old apparently often occurred during boy scout meetings in a hidden location at the meeting place. Lucas was acting as the troop leader at the time of the crime.

Since the time of the defendant's arrest, boy scout leaders and other officials have conducted an extensive investigation into area scout troops to search for other possible incidents of abuse. After several months of this investigation, no other evidence of any type of abuse has been found, according to a spokesperson.

Lucas was remanded to the Garrett County Sheriff after sentencing. Defense attorney for the defendant was Robert C. Hesson.

Manning To Serve 10 Years; Other Sex Cases Heard

Judge Fred'A. Thayer of the Garrett County Circuit Court sentenced convicted child abuser Roberta Manning, 34, Oakland, on Thursday to ten years in the Maryland Department of Corrections. Mrs. Manning was remanded to the custody of the Garrett County Sheriff after sentencing, and will receive credit for time served (197 days).

Manning pleaded guilty to the child abuse charge at a February hearing, and a pre-sentence investigation was ordered by Thayer at that time. Other charges against the defendant that were not prosecuted included second degree rape, second and third degree sex offense, and unnatural and perverted sex practice.

The charges stemmed from incidents involving a 13-year-old male, which occurred during the months of January through October of 1990.

Defense attorney for the defendant was John R. Toston.

Donald W. Manning Sr., 37, Oakland, husband of Roberta Manning, pleaded guilty to a child abuse charge during the Thursday proceedings. The plea was accepted by Thayer, and a presentence investigation was ordered.

Other counts against this defendant include second and

Manning, Lucas Sex Offense Case Heard In Court

Roberta Manning, 34, and

Both Manning and Lucas
were allegedly involved in
the ongoing sexual abuse of
a 14 year-old male occurring
over several months in 1990.

Roberta Manning pleaded guilty to child abuse after a plea agreement, according to the court document. Judge Thayer accepted the plen and ordered a presentence investigation. Manning's bail was revoked, by order of the court, and she was remanded to the Garrett County Sheriff.

Charges against Manning that were not prosecuted were second degree rape, second degree sex offense, unnatural and perverted sex practice, and incest. The charges were brought against the defendant on October 31, 1990, when police received a tip that sexual abuse was occurring to the 14-year-old boy.

Also charged at that time was Manning's husband, Donald W. Manning Sr. Manning has yet to face his charges of child abuse and sex offenses, as his trial was continued last Friday, according to the court document.

John R. Toston defended Mrs. Manning.

Randy Lucas pleaded guilty to second degree sex offense. Thayer accepted the plea and ordered a pre-sen-

Lucas was also charged with third degree sex offense and unnatural and perverted sex practice. These charges were not prosecuted.

Charges against Lucas stemmed from his apparent sexual abuse of the same 14-year-old. When asked when and where the abuse occurred, Lucas reportedly said that it often happened during boy scout meetings in a hidden area. Lucas was the leader of the scout troop, according to the court document.

Defense counsel for Lucas was Robert C. Hesson.

OAKLAND - Local authorities have confirmed that three local residents have been arrested on child and sex abuse charges, stemming from crimes they allegedly committed against a 13-year-old boy.

The Garrett County State's Attorney's Office Wednesday released information concerning the arrests of Roberta Manning, 34, Donald Wayne Manning Sr., 37, and Randy Ray Lucas, 19, all of Oakland.

The Mannings, husband and

wife, were arrested Nov. 8, :while Lucas was arrested Nov. 9 following a tip to the Garrett County Department of Social: Services and the Oakland City; Police Department, officials

The Mannings remain incarcerated in the Garrett County. Jail on \$50,000 full bond apiece, while Lucas has been released when 10 percent of his \$25,000 bond was posted Sunday.

Roberta Manning faces six charges, including four felony charges and two misdemeanors. The felony charges (Continued From Page 1)

, Donald Wayne Manning Sr. was also charged with four felony and two misdemeanor crimes. The felony counts include child abuse, child under 18, imprisonment of 15 years maximum; second-degree sex offense, under-age victim. 20 years maximum; third-degree sex offense, under-age victim, .10 years maximum; and sodomy, 10 years maximum.

Misdemeanor charges against the man include perverted practice, punishable by 10 years and/or \$1,000, and battery, with punishment set by the sitting judge.

Lucas was charged with two ifelonies and one misdemeanor. including second-degree sex offense, under-age victim, 20 years maximum, third-degree sex offense, under-age victim, 10 years maximum, and battery; with punishment to be set by the judge.

Court documents indicated that the sexual acts occurred between January and October of this year, and all crimes involved the same juvenile, who was 13 years old at the time the .acts occurred.

"This kind of crime angers a person that it does happen, but it also scares you because there is more of it out there," said Lisa C. Thayer, assistant state's attorney for Garrett 'County "More of these cases come to light now because of the media coverage and atten-

"Due to the nature of the crime and the extent of harm caused to the child or children involved, this office will fully prosecute, and request appropriate punishments.

Arrest reports filed by the Oakland City Police Depart--ment, and obtained in the court, istated that Roberta Manning signed a written statement that she had engaged in sexual in-...tercourse with the juvenile, and thad sexual contact in the egenital area with the youth.

... Donald Wayne Manning signed a statement which said that he had engagd in anal and . or al sex with the same juvenile.

Lucas signed a statment which said that he had engaged in oral sex with the juvenile.

Officials in Garrett County District Court and Garrett County Circuit Court indicated that no court dates had been set for the three as of yet.
