

MEMORANDUM ON 10-12-88 MEETING WITH DENNIS NICHOLSON

On Wednesday, October 12, 1988 at 4:00 p.m. a meeting was held with Dennis Nicholson at the Council Service Center. Participants in the meeting were: Dennis Nicholson, Scoutmaster of Troop 179 in Cedar Falls; Harry Sullivan, Council Vice President; Tom Stovall, Scout Executive; and Tom Przybylski, Senior District Executive of Wabuha District.

Nicholson was given a letter which he read indicating that his registration with the Boy Scouts of America had been suspended and that he was to sever any relations with the Boy Scouts of America. He was also given a copy of the procedures to be followed if he wished to have this decision reviewed, and was given a check for \$5.00 as a refund of his adult registration fee.

Nicholson was told that the council has determined that his leadership ability did not meet the standards of membership in the B.S.A. and that this action was being taken in the best interests of the Scouting program. He was also told that the suspension of his registration would be kept confidential and that we only wish that he sever all ties and activities with Scouting.

The procedures for the review of this decision was discussed and Nicholson was told that if he wished to have it reviewed that he would need to submit a letter to the council within 60 days requesting a review.

The meeting was ended and Nicholson left at approximately 4:25 p.m.



Dear Mr. Nicholson:

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for review are attached.

Procedures for review of registration suspension





APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the decision.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may—if he or she does not agree with the decision—request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.
