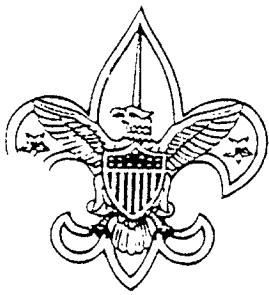

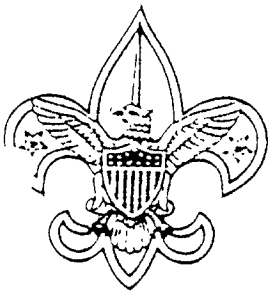

Dear Mr. Peetz,

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted or reinstated. The procedures for review are attached.

APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW
OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
5. The applicant may - if he or she does not agree with the decision - request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.

JUDGMENT UPON PLEA OF GUILTY

8 This matter came before the Court on March 4, 1988 for final
9 hearing. The State of Oregon appeared by Rick Knapp, Deputy
10 District Attorney. The defendant appeared in person and with
11 counsel Michael Sahagian.

12 It appearing to the Court that defendant has been heretofore
13 duly informed against, arraigned and upon a guilty plea, duly
14 convicted of the crime of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree in Count
15 2.

16 It further appearing to the Court that more than 48 hours has
17 elapsed since plea entry and that now is the proper time to pass
18 sentence and judgment of the Court upon said conviction. There
19 appearing no good cause why sentence should not now be passed,
20 because the Court is fully advised.

21 It is therefore CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED by the Court
22 that as to Count 2 imposition of sentence upon defendant be
23 suspended and defendant is placed on probation under the
24 supervision and control of Washington County Community
25 Corrections/State of Oregon Corrections Department for a period of
26 five (5) years, subject to all of the general conditions of

1 probation as set forth in ORS 137.540(1), and the following special
2 conditons of probation:

- 3 1. Pay a \$20.00 per month probation service fee; as directed
4 by probation officer;
- 5 2. Contribute 200 hours of personal time to a community
6 service project under the direction of probation officer,
7 to be completed within two (2) years (100 hours per year)
8 of this date;

9 Further, defendant shall pay a \$20.00 community service
10 fee to Washington County Community Corrections if
11 required;

- 12 3. Defendant shall have no direct or indirect contact with
13 the victim, [REDACTED] or with any other minor
14 females without the prior written consent of his probation
15 officer;
- 16 4. That, as provided by ORS 163.665, 163.670, 163.675, and
17 163.680, defendant shall not possess any printed,
18 photograph, or recorded materials that he may use for the
19 purpose of his deviant sexual arousal; nor shall he
20 frequent any place where such material is available to him
21 for the purpose of deviant sexual arousal;
- 22 5. That defendant shall undergo a complete psychological
23 evaluation designed to address the issue of his sexually
24 deviant behavior and, specifically, to determine if he
25 should be prohibited from possessing any photographs,
26 drawings, magazines or other printed materials, motion
pictures, video recordings, or audio recordings, or from
frequenting any place where such material is available,
that the evaluator has identified as items the defendant
might likely use for the purpose of his deviant sexual
arousal;
6. That, pursuant to the results of the psychological
evaluation, the defendant is prohibited from possessing
any photographs, drawings, magazines, or other printed
material, motion pictures, video recordings, or audio
recordings, that the evaluation has identified as items
the defendant might use for the purpose of his deviant
sexual arousal; he is further prohibited from frequenting
any place where such material is available to him;
7. Defendant shall submit to any program of physiological
assessment at the discretion of his probation officer, to

1 include the use of the plethysmograph, to assist in
2 treatment, case planning and case monitoring; any refusal
to submit to such assessment is a violation of probation;


3 8. Defendant shall submit to polygraph testing, at his own
4 expense, which may be recommended by the probation officer
5 to determine if he is in compliance with the conditions of
6 his probation and/or to facilitate mental health
7 treatment; any refusal to submit to such testing is a
8 violation of probation;

9 9. That defendant's person, residence, or any vehicle which
10 he may be operating, or in which he is a passenger, are
11 subject to search at any time by his probation officer,
12 without prior notice or search warrant, to determine if he
13 is in compliance with the conditions of his probation; any
14 refusal to submit to such a search is a violation of
15 probation;

16 It is further ORDERED that defendant pay a victim assistance
17 penalty assessment in the amount of \$50.00, pursuant to ORS 147.259
18 and 147.265, to be paid through the Clerk of the Court within 90
19 days.

20 It is further ORDERED that Count 1 of the information charging
21 the defendant with the crime of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree
22 be, and the same hereby is, DISMISSED.
