Ex-Md. Scoutmaster Gets 15 Years for Child Abuse

David MacDonald Rankin, a former College Park Boy Scout leader, was sentenced yesterday to 15 years in prison for what a Prince George's Circuit Court judge called the "absolutely incredible" crime of having members of his troop perform sex acts with him.

"I honestly find this troubling case to be overwhelming," Johnson said, "and I find the offenses that were committed with these young boys absolutely incredible.

"It cries out for punishment," the judge continued. "It cries out for deterrence."

The case against Rankin, an Eagle Scout and an honorably discharged Marine, spurred the National Capital Area Council Boy Scouts of America to come up with a new plan to help prevent child abuse in scout units.

The Boy Scouts of America had already maintained a computerized reference system that lists more than 2,000 former Boy Scout leaders who have had problems ranging from alcoholism to inability to manage funds, but not all names make it into the system.

The plan, released Dec. 15, did not any new screening of Boya it volunteers. Instead, it emphasized adherence to the Scout Oath—"to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake and morally straight"—and self-monitoring of behavior by scout leaders.

Rankin was arrested May 11, after the father of one of the victims notified officials of the National Capital Area Council.

About six months before that, said Assistant State's Attorney

Thomas McManus, the father arrived earlier than planned to pick up his son from a scout meeting and thought he saw Rankin playing with his son's genital area. The father waited before notifying officials, McManus said, because his son denied for several months that anything had happened.

Rankin had led Troop 740 for five years before his arrest last spring. Eight of the incidents occurred with scouts ages 14 to 16 during the weekly troop meetings at a hall adjacent to Holy Redeemer Catholic Church in College Park. Three other incidents occurred at an overnight camping trip with the troop in Charles County. All of them happened between early 1985 and February 1987.

Rankin "had a clear sense from the beginning that what he was doing was wrong," McManus said.

"Some of the victims can talk about it with openness and candidness," McManus said. "They don't appear to be emotionally scarred, at least not on the surface. But others among the victims will be scarred for the rest of their lives."

A psychiatrist and a psychologist who have been counseling and treating Rankin since last summer concluded that Rankin suffered from a poor self-image and became involved in scouting "where he would be accepted and could excel," said Joseph DePaul, Rankin's attorney. The crimes were committed, according to DePaul's reading of the health professionals' evaluation of

Rankin, to bolster his self-esteem:

Judge Johnson said that Rankin violated the trust parents have in organizations such as the Boy Scouts to help shape their children.

"I can recall personally the influences that the scoutmaster had on me," he said. "To have that trust violated to the extent that you violated it cannot be condoned, cannot be explained away by a sense of low self-esteem."

Ex-Scout leader gets 15-year term for abusing boys

A former Boy Scout leader faces 15 years in prison for sexually abusing eight teen-age troop members in Prince George's and Charles counties.

Circuit Judge G.R. Hovey Johnson yesterday sentenced David McDonald Rankin to 15-year sentences for each of 11 counts of child abuse and specified that they should run concurrently, according to the Prince George's state's attorney's office.

Rankin, 29, was scoutmaster of Troop 740 of Holy Redeemer Catholic Church in College Park when he was taken into custody last May 11.

The arrest came six months after a father who had arrived early to pick up his son from a meeting saw Rankin fondling the boy, said Assistant State's Attorney Thomas McManus.

The son of the man who witnessed the abuse denied for several months that anything had happened, McManus said.

Rankin told the scouts the sex acts were part of initiation into a special group within the troop called "The Rowdies."

Rankin pleaded guilty in November to eight counts of child abuse in Prince George's County.

Calling it a crime that "cries out for punishment," Circuit Court Judge G.R. Hovey Johnson sentenced a former Scoutmaster in College Park to 15 years in prison for sexually abusing 11 youths under his care.
"I was a Boy Scout," Judge Johnson told

"I was a Boy Scout," Judge Johnson told the former Scoutmaster, David MacDonald Rankin, during sentencing yesterday. "I find the offense that was committed against these boys to be absolutely incredible... It cries out for deterrent."

Rankin, 28, of Adelphi, apologized and asked the judge for "whatever leniency you see fit."

"I never intended to harm anyone," Rankin said. "I have repented."

His attorney, Joseph DePaul, asked for a sentence of probation with psychiatric counseling, arguing that Rankin has no prior criminal record, is "remorseful" and is being treated by two psychiatrists who cite improvement.

But Johnson said prosecutors were "extremely lenient" in accepting a plea bargain agreement under which Rankin would serve no more than 15 years in prison.

Rankin could have received a maximum 165 years without the agreement.

Assistant State's Attorney Thomas McManus said he accepted the agreement because of Rankin's clean record and immediate guilty pleas. McManus also dropped other charges against Rankin.

But he said Rankin "manipulated" his victims and "used their youthful desires and blossoming sexuality... for his own sexual gratification."

Rankin was indicted last June on 32 counts of sexual child abuse and other related sexual offenses in 12 separate incidents between September 1985 and April 1987 involving eight members of his Scout troop. Three additional sexual child abuse charges were added a week after the indictments.

According to police, Rankin admitted that he had been sexually involved with the Scouts.

Rankin, a former Boy Scout, had been active in his church and was honorably discharged from the Marines Corps after an injury.

Johnson said it was "extremely difficult" to decide upon a sentence because of Rankin's clean record. But he said Rankin committed crimes against young boys who are impressionable. "I can recall the influence that the Scoutmaster had on us," he said of his Boy Scout days.

David MacDonald Rankin, a former College Park Boy Scout leader, pleaded guilty yesterday in a Prince George's County court to eight counts of child abuse for having members of his troop perform sex acts with him.

Rankin, 28, who was scoutmaster of Troop 740 at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church for five years until his arrest in May, stood straight with his hands at his sides while Circuit Court Judge G.R. Hovey Johnson read the charges stemming from Rankin's sexual contact with eight teen-aged scouts.

His only dispute was with some of the dates of the offenses provided by Assistant State's Attorney Thomas McManus. Rankin admitted that the dozens of incidents occurred, just as he did when county investigators first questioned him in May.

"I really don't know how all of this got started," Rankin told police, according to a statement McManus read in court yesterday. "I must have been sick or something to let it get started."

McManus said that Rankin told his victims

that the sexual acts were part of an initiation ceremony into a special group within the troop called "The Rowdies." The chosen scouts, the prosecutor said, were required to remove their clothes and masturbate.

FINAL REPORT

Boy Scout Troop #740

On May 12, 1987 the Department of Social Services received a referral alleging on-going, inappropriate sexual behavior between a boy scout member of troop #740 and an adult troop leader. receipt of the initial referral, the Department of Social Services notified the State's attorney's office, Mrs. Carol Fagen of Social Services Administration, Audrey Sutton, Deputy Director and Henry Gunn, Director. The Department also contacted Mr. Paul R. Davis, Jr., Scout Executive, at the Boy Scouts of America National Headquarters in Bethesda, Maryland and obtained lists of names and addresses of the boys who participated in Boy Scout Troop \$740 for the entire period the alleged perpetrator was in a leadership role within the troop. Mr. Davis also supplied the names and addresses of youth members of the Patuxent Chapter Dance Team. This dance team was an offshoot of the boy scout troop. Once again, the alleged perpetrator participated in the Dance Team in a leadership role.

Telephone calls were made to call the parents of the minor boys and to the young men (who are now adults) inviting them to one of two group meetings. These meetings were held at the Department's Ager Road office on June 10, 1987 and June 11, 1987 and were conducted jointly by Protective Services workers, the CID Detectives, and members from the Sexual Assault Center. The meetings were not well attended by parents and only five young men attended. These five were interviewed privately by Protective Service workers after the meeting was concluded.

All of the families, those who attended the meetings and those who did not attend the meetings were mailed follow-up letters. Included in these letters was the HDS pamphlet Child Sexual Abuse Prevention which discussed the Physical and behavioral signs that are common among children who have been sexually molested. If any or some of these symptoms were evident, they were urged to seek help through the Sexual Assault Center and telephone numbers were included. Services through Protective Services were also offered and telephone numbers were supplied.

As a result of the investigation, seven sexual abuses were "confirmed" and six were "indicated". Most of the abuse began as innitiation into a select group called "the Rowdies". All the members of this group were also members of the Boy Scout Troop \$740, and the alleged perpetrator was again one of the leaders. Fifty six (56) cases were determined as "uncertain" and five were "ruled out".

The number of confirmed and indicated sexual abuse cases is very high and raises serious concerns pertaining to the adequacy of supervision for all troop activities. It is recommended that no troop leader should ever conduct a hike, overnight, or any other activity sponsored by the Boy Scout Troop by him or herself. At least two leaders should be present at all times. It is also recommended that all leaders and potential leaders participate in a sexual abuse prevention training program.

5 in Adelphi Troop Are Alleged Victims

An Adelphi Boy Scout leader has been charged with five counts of child sexual abuse for allegedly having members of his troop perform sex acts with him as part of a purported initiation rite, Prince George's County police said yesterday.

David MacDonald Rankin, 28, of 2113 Rolander St., an Eagle Scout and an honorably discharged Marine who has led the troop for five years, was held last night in the county correctional center in lieu of \$100,000 bond.

Carl Gell, general counsel for Boy Scouts of America and vice president of the National Capital Area Council Boy Scouts of America, said yesterday that he knew of no cases in the Washington area with so many alleged victims

"It is probably the biggest case of this sort to ever come down the road," said Gell, who added that Rankin is one of about 15,000 scouting volunteers in the area, which comprises the District and 16 counties from Fredericksburg, Va., to Frederick, Md.

Although the Boy Scouts of America has a computerized reference system that lists more than 2,000 former Boy Scout leaders who have had problems ranging from alcoholism to inability to manage funds, not all members' names make it into the system.

In September 1985, a Reston scoutmaster who pleaded guilty to

Cpl. Bruce Gentile, a police spokesman, said that victims told investigators that Rankin had the youths perform the acts as part of an initiation into the Order of the Arrow, which Boy Scout leaders described as a service organization and honor society in scouting.

Certain information has come to my knowledge in my capacity as the First Counselor to the Bishop of the Carrollton Ward, of the Silver Spring Stake, of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, pertaining to the probable comission of offenses under the State of Maryland laws.

Normally this knowledge would be classified as confidential information under the relationship between the clergy and a church member; however, in view of the gravity of the probable offenses, and of the need to ensure that such offenses do not continue to occur in the future, and in the best interests of the community, and after discussions with higher church priesthood leaders, it is felt that this knowledge should be made available to the appropriate secular authorities for appropriate corrective action. 

On Monday, May 11, 1987, David M. Rankin, Scoutmaster of Troop 740, was charged by the Prince Georges County Police with five counts of child sexual abuse for allegedly having members of an Order of the Arrow Dance team perform sex acts with him as part of a purported initiation rite. The incidents allegedly occurred between early 1985 and February of 1987.

Concern over the matter was first brought to the Council's attention on April 27 by a district scouter after he has been alerted by a parent of one of the boys. The parents had suspicions of the problem since October of 1986 but did not speak to any one about it, apparently fearing physical harm to the boy.


When brought to our attention, the situation moved "up the ladder" from the District Executive to the Scout Executive. Paul Davis called me and we reviewed the facts as presented in a confidential memo. We felt the information gave us reason to contact the appropriate

David MacDonald Rankin, 28, of ·2113 Rolander St., an Eagle Scout and an honorably discharged Marine who has led the troop for five years, was held last night in the county correctional center in lieu of \$100,000 bond.

Carl Gell, general counsel for Boy Scouts of America and vice president of the National Capital Area Council Boy Scouts of America, said yesterday that he kenw of no cases in the Washington area with so many alleged victims.

"It is probably the biggest case of this sort to ever come down the road," said Gell, who added that Rankin is one of about 15,000 scouting volunteers in the area, which comprises the District and 16 counties from Fredericksburg, Va., to Frederick, Md.

Although the Boy Scouts of America has a computerized reference system that lists more than 2,000 former Boy Scout leaders who have had problems ranging from alcoholism to inability to manage funds, not all members' names make it into the system.

Scout leader faces abuse charges

One Boy Scouts official described David MacDonald Rankin as a "sterling" choice to be a troop leader.

'He had been active in his church. He had been honorably discharged from the U.S. Marines," he had been a Scout and had no criminal record. said Carl Gell, legal counsel for the National Capital Council of Boy Scouts of America.

But yesterday, Rankin, 28, of Adelphi, was being held on \$100,000 bond in the Prince George's County Corrections Center on charges that over the past two years he has sexually abused five of the three dozen or so Scouts in his College Park troop.

'It's a shame,'' said Gell, referring to Rankin's arrest on Monday. "It was the Boy Scouts - I myself who brought this to the Prince George's County Criminal Investiga-

tion Division.

Police say the sexual abuse took place in a room at a College Park church where the troop met regularly.

The investigation leading to Rankin's arrest came after the father of a Scout "saw what he thought was his son involved in a sexual act" with Rankin last October, according to charging documents filed in Prince George's District Court.

The victim admitted to the abuse and stated that several other boys were involved," the documents say.

The Scout said Rankin had the teenage Scouts perform sex acts "in order to get into his select Scout group" within the troop, the documents say.

Rankin admitted in a written statement to police that he had been sexually involved with the Scouts, the charging document says.

At a bond hearing yesterday, Judge Steven Platt denied Rankin's request that he be released on personal recognizance.

"I went in voluntarily before the police asked me. I've cooperated with the police all the way through, said Rankin, a manager at Gilbert Guns Unlimited in Rockville.

Platt cited the severity of the charges and the fact that Rankin's parents, with whom he lives, were on vacation and could not be reached.

Outside the courtroom yesterday, the Rev. John Hamilton, who said he has been a family friend of Rankin's for five years, expressed his surprise over the charges lodged against the Scout leader.





"We still have the actual victims," Law said. "Three more [alleged victims came forward on their own. We didn't discover them through tapes."

Robert Bonsib, the deputy state's attorney for Prince George's, declined to comment about the tape recordings because of the ongoing criminal investigation of Rankin.

Rankin, who scouting officials said has been involved with Boy Scouts of America since his youth,




