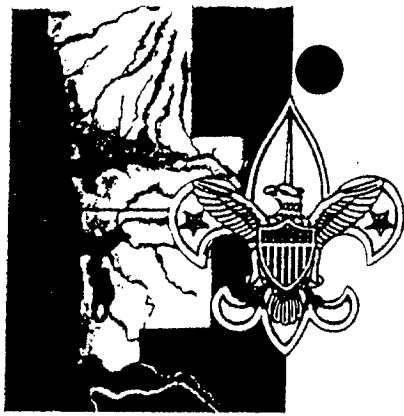

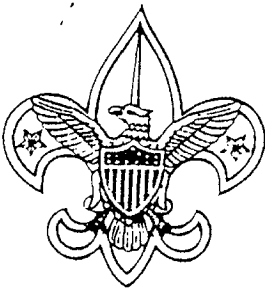

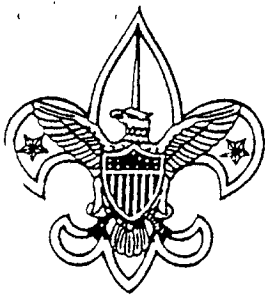

Dear Mr. Schaefer,

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA regional review committee, please write to the regional director within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

██████████ called Chris this a.m. Scoutmaster called son, ██████, "wants to get together on a sexual relationship with son."

T-211 SM is Glen Schaffer - also SM of LDS troop in Long Beach, WA. Chris will meet with ██████ at 4:00 p.m. today, and has asked that she and her son both prepare written statements.

██████ had taken matter to counselor at school, who called ██████ at 7:00 a.m. this morning to ask her to come to school to discuss.

Chris will also ask the school counselor to prepare a written statement.

Chris will call me today after meeting with ██████████, and will come in Friday with the statements.

On the tenth of September, Glen Schaffer, a man I know through Scouting, called me. He told me that his name was Glen Schaffer. I had been told of previous calls from him but not hearing from him for about four years, I forgot to call him back. After I had gotten home from school on the tenth, Glen called me at about 4:00 P.M. Our conversation ended about 5:00 P.M. At the beginning of the conversation he talked about scouting and that he hadn't seen me for a while. Then he told me that he would like to start a relationship with me. I asked what kind of a relationship and he replied a friends relationship and asked what kind of relationship did I have in mind. That made me think that maybe this wasn't a homosexual call. Then we talked about what we had in common and a date that we could get together. All this time I didn't know whether I wanted to see him because he was someone I knew from scouting and respected. It was also odd that he called me after four years of not seeing each other. When I had seen him before it was only once that I remember. I worked with him at a summer camp for an inter troop campfire. Then he told me that when we got together that he wanted to tell me some personal stuff. I said O.K. not knowing what that was. Then he asked me if any one was home and no one was at that time, so he then asked if he could tell me the personal stuff that he had mentioned over the phone. I said kind of warily, O.K. and then he began. The first thing that he told me was that he had had a dream involving himself and myself. In the dream we were having sex. This shocked me speechless for a second. Then he told me that he really liked me and liked me a lot. He also told me then that he would like to have sex with me. If at all possible on the date we were to get together. That date was to be the 26th of September. Then he wanted to know where we could do it and if I knew any back roads where people didn't go very often. I told him that I didn't know. Then he said thank you for letting him tell me all this and then proceeded to make plans for the day that we were going to get together. He wanted me to bring a warm ski jacket to lay down on the ground when we "did it." Then he had to go so we hung up. From the rest of that day to the beginning of school I decided to go to the school counselor, Ron Miller. We talked and then my mom was brought in and he told her and she in turn told my dad. If Glen is found that he has done this to more than one boy, I hope that this can help in any way.

September 13, 1990

On Friday of last week my wife mentioned to me that [REDACTED] had said the [REDACTED] High School counselor wanted to see us soon. Seth would not say why, but that it was important. [REDACTED] saw the counselor before school on Wednesday and learned that [REDACTED] had been approached by Glenn Schaffer by telephone.

I happened to finish work early on Wednesday and called [REDACTED] at work to tell her that I planned to leave work early to go to Longview, and she told me that we needed to talk, and filled me in briefly about the meeting with the counselor that morning. We met for lunch and this was the first I heard about the incident.

She told me that she had learned that Glenn had called [REDACTED] and asked him to be his boyfriend. He had also told [REDACTED] not to tell anyone that he had called. We were quite shocked about this and most of our conversation was quite guarded. We agreed that the Council needed to know immediately, and that we would sit down and talk with [REDACTED] as soon as possible that evening. [REDACTED] told me that she had made an appointment with Chris Shelby at four o'clock to discuss what was going on and what had happened up to this point. I did not attend the meeting.

I picked up [REDACTED] from school Wednesday evening and told him that Mom had told me what was happening. I assured [REDACTED] that he had done the right thing. We weren't able to talk more because we gave another boy a ride home, but after dropping him off we talked a little and I became fairly confident that [REDACTED] was handling things pretty well. [REDACTED] said that this was the first time Glenn had mentioned this to him. He also said he did not know if Glenn had approached any other boys. [REDACTED] told me that Glenn had told him in the phone conversation that he had wanted to ask him to be his partner before but never had the opportunity. I told him that he would need to write down all he could remember with as much detail as possible, including dates and times.

In the past week, starting with last Wednesday, I have had to work some very long hours, so I was not around [REDACTED] enough to notice any changes in his normal personality. Typically [REDACTED] is pretty quiet and keeps to himself. He is very self-reliant and disciplined, so it is not unusual for him to be in his room reading or off by himself studying, so I am not too surprised that I didn't notice any changes, or that he would go talk to his counselor rather than us. He doesn't show emotion, and tends to keep things that bother him to himself too so I think it may be difficult to measure how deeply this could have affected him. My first impression is that he is now relieved that he has let it out, and is

confident that he won't get in trouble or be blamed for anything. One thing for sure [REDACTED] is very honest, he wouldn't make up a story like this.

I have known Glenn for many years. I met him through Scouting as did most of us. So I wasn't surprised when Glenn called me a few weeks ago. I don't remember the day but he called to ask permission to attend one of my troop meetings. He had talked to me about this at Camporee last spring and I had forgotten about it. It is interesting to me that I felt a little odd about his call at the time. I don't know why, but I did. I don't remember much more about that call, but Glenn called me again on Labor day. This time we talked about him visiting a troop meeting again, only I remember him explicitly asking if [REDACTED] was still going to meetings. That old "odd" feeling was back, but still, it isn't out of the ordinary for scoutmasters to discuss scouts whenever they are talking to one another.

I remember telling Glenn that [REDACTED] was attending meetings at the time but that I was sure he would be too busy with school activities once school started. We also discussed some of the other boys which Glenn would know but [REDACTED] was the main topic. I told Glenn that he was welcome to attend any meeting but that he should call me beforehand so I could tell him of any changes or whatever. That conversation was a lingering one, Glenn wanted to keep asking questions and talking. I was busy working on my troop's annual plan and wanted to get back to it. -

All I have stated is true as I remember it. nothing written above is speculative or imagined.

To Whom This May Concern:

On September 11, 1990 my son, [REDACTED], told me that the school counselor, Mr. Miller, would like to see me as soon as possible. On September 12, 1990 at 7:00 a.m., Mr. Miller contacted me and asked that I speak with him prior to beginning the work day. We met at approximately 7:15 a.m. that morning. [REDACTED] attended the conference.

Mr. Miller informed me that [REDACTED] had been contacted by telephone by a male, approximately 21 years of age, who was someone [REDACTED] knew through the scouting program and "wanted to be [REDACTED]'s boyfriend." I have since learned that this was Mr. Miller's terminology. [REDACTED] had received this telephone call between 4:00 and 5:00 p.m. on Monday, September 10, 1990. He was at home alone at the time. He did not mention the telephone call to anyone. He felt uncomfortable speaking to his father or I about the telephone conversation, but did want us to know, which is the reason he contacted his school counselor. [REDACTED] informed Mr. Miller that this was not a relationship he wanted to pursue but did not know how to handle the situation.

In speaking privately with [REDACTED] he informed me that the caller had been Glenn Schaefer. [REDACTED] said the telephone conversation started as a friendly conversation that discussed beginning a friendship, then progressed to Glenn specifically requesting a more intimate relationship. Glenn informed [REDACTED] that he had intended to make contact with [REDACTED] at Camporee this last spring, but [REDACTED] had left before he had the chance. Glenn said he would call [REDACTED] on September 24, 1990 for his answer.

[REDACTED] has asked that his father and I contact Glenn and ask him not to have contact with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] does not want to see or talk to Glenn, but is also uncomfortable with his father or I contacting Glenn because Glenn asked him not to tell anyone of the telephone conversation.

[REDACTED] can't remember having contact with Glenn since his first year of summer camp at Meriweather in 1987 (Glenn was on staff). Glenn was always a visible figure at district functions while [REDACTED] was a cub scout.

At approximately 6:50pm on 9/14/90 District Chairman Dick Phillips and I delivered the letter ~~was~~ suspending the membership of Orren Glen Schaefer. Mr. Schaefer read the letter and asked why he was receiving this and what had he did wrong. He was told the Columbia Pacific Council had evidence that he does not meet the standards of membership. Again he asked what he did wrong and seemed confused, visibly shaken. I asked him to cease all scouting activities and he would report to the Regional Office.

Glen Schacter call me at home questioning why the Chartered organization had not been contacted. I explained it was an oversight on our part but the Partner would be contacted. He again questioned what he did wrong and I emphasized that the Council had evidence that points that Glen doesn't meet the high standards of the BSA. Glen said he is going to appeal. Then ~~he~~ said, "he hadn't touched any one." I questioned what he meant. He said "he hadn't done anything sexual." I said I wasn't accusing him of anything. Glen replied, "I'd get to the bottom of this and I'd see whoever is responsible." I re-emphasized his right to an appeal and could contact the Sicut Executive but wasn't sure what he would say. Again Glen said he already had a lawyer and would see. Again I told him about the appeal process. After that our conversation ended.

8. I suggested to ██████ it would be best if he told his parents so they could offer support to him and help to take proper steps in dissolving this matter.
9. ██████ agreed and said he wanted to tell his parents. He indicated he could use help in presenting this matter to his parents.
10. I agreed to ask his parents to come to school and we would all talk about the problem together.
11. ██████ came to school and the three of us discussed the matter.
12. ██████ was very supportive of her son. I wish more parents could be as supportive as ██████ was to ██████.
