Consultants: Dr. Philip Burstein was called in consultation for a general medical workup as well as to see if there could be any endocrinological problems in view of the extreme youthfulness that this man displays in regard to his chronological age.

A thyroid profile, FSH, and LH were within normal limits. Blood has been drawn from chromosone studies but the results of that will not be available for approximately one month.

Dr. John Coonan was called in consultation because the patient had complained of some rectal pain and bleeding. Dr. Coonan performed a rectal examination and a sigmoidoscopy and found some small internal hemorrhoids and instructed the patient how to treat those with Anusol suppositories.

Dr. John Smith was called in consultation because the patient complained of pain in his left knee which he experienced after it was hyperextended a few weeks ago. Dr. Smith did not feel that there had been any serious structural damage and that strengthening exercises which he instructed the patient in would suffice.

Dr. Erik Kreutzer was called in consultation because the patient had been kicked in his left TMJ area. Dr. Kreutzer concluded that he had suffered a mild concussion but could find no bony structural damage.

Condition at the time of discharge: Improved.

Discharge instructions: The patient will be discharged to then be admitted today at Bethesda Psychiatric Hospital for a psychiatric hospitalization. He has been instructed regarding his knee and will follow through there.

SUMMARY: This is a 29 year old white single minister who had become very anxious and depressed and was having serious difficulty functioning in his congregation. He had begun to turn to very young teenagers, 14 and 16 year olds as his main support system and some acting out to place in the form of drinking too much and possibly some activities under the influence of alcohol that were not healthy for anyone involved. The parishioners were upset that Pastor Wilson had made 2 suicide attempts/gestures with overdoses of first an antibiotic and then antihistamines. He was admitted for complete psychiatric and psychological evaluation and for treatment of his acute situation.

functions, FSH, LH, skull series, panarex were all within normal limits. AVDRL was negative.

Rectal examination and sigmoidoscopy revealed small internal hemorrhoids. An NMPI revealed a very serious borderline personality disorder with tremendous amounts of anxiety and depression.

HOSPITAL COURSE: The patient was treated in psychotherapy by Dr. Sonja Plattner, PhD and Dr. Ramona Reed. Dr. Reed placed him on Navane and a combination of the therapy, the structure of the hospital and the major tranquillizer helped the patient reconstitute from his acute overwhelming anxiety and depression but it became obvious from the evaluation that he has very serious psychiatric oroblems that need to be dealt with. Psychiatric hospitalization was offered to him and arrangements have been made for him to be admitted to Bethesda Psychiatric Hospital on November 16th.

Prognosis is good.

Treatment plan: The treatment plan is for him to be discharged from Lutheran Medical Center and to be admitted to Bethesda Psychiatric Hospital with his primary therapist there being Dr. Eric Briden, PhD.

This information was received from Bill Moncrief, Corvallis, Oregon 97330. Moncrief is the Scoutmaster of Troop 258 chartered to Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church. He detailed the incident between Roy Wilson and , a Scout in Troop 258. His address is , Snedd, Oregon 97377. The incident took place on a 50-mile hike that happened in August, 1985. Roy Wilson was acting as an Assistant Scoutmaster although not registered in that position. Wilson had a practice of sleeping nude in his sleeping bag. On one particular night he was in the tent with Wilson told that his back hurt and asked him to rub his back. After some insistence, the boy complied and gave Roy a backrub. After that Roy said that he would rub back. Said he didn't wish to have a backrub, but Roy insisted after he rubbed his back he had the boy turn over and he straddled and rubbed his shoulders. Said that Roy's muscles were very tense and his eyes bulged out and he acted very strange.

Approximately four months after this incident on the 50-mile hike took place, Scout told his mother and she contacted the Scoutmaster. At that time the Scoutmaster and the head of the chartered organization and other parents met with Roy Wilson to hear his side of the incident. Following that time they told him he was to no longer have any connection with a troop.

Subsequently, Roy Wilson has showed up at troop activities such as Courts of Honor and has been told by Bill Monorief repeatedly to leave.

I made no attempt to contact either _____ or his parents since the information we have is first-hand from the Scoutmaster.



is not normally sexually attracted to 9 and 10 year olds, which was the age group of the children at this annual pledge talk, that they nonetheless look for the children beginning at that age and then develop them as potential victims. He felt at that time that based on what he observed Tobiassen was probably justifiably under suspicion, but it was not his case at that time.

Rooson explained that during the aftermath of the charges against Tobiassen that he received an anonymous letter to his office (which is attached as the last two pages of the incident report I mailed to you previously). That letter reports that the writer believes Tobiassen is the same Tobiassen who was under suspicion of child molestation in Nevada City, California. Because of that letter Robson phoned the sheriff's office in that town and spoke with a retired undersheriff who confirmed the reports made by the writer of the anonymous letter. Apparently no criminal charges were filed but the impression Robson got was that Tobiassen was "shooed" out of town.

The last part of my conversation with Robson was rather disturbing. He said that he has a scouting leader in the local area under some form of investigation right now. This person, whose name he would not release, was allegedly reported to Robson by somebody within the scouting organization. He would not give me the name of his informant. He did say that the suspect is an ordained minister and that the offenses occurred in a county other than Benton so that any trial that occurs, if charges are brought, will not be filed in Benton County. (See more on this below.)

Robson is a nice appearing man and was very frank with me, but his comments regarding the supposed discussions with Harris is disturbing. I will be speaking to Harris next week, in Eugene, and will go into it in some detail with him.

George Grosch

This man is a former district executive in Corvallis who came to the position after the charges against Tobiassen were public. He went to work for the district in November of 1984. He believes he stayed until May 1, 1986. His direct supervisor was Dick Clark, who was the assistant scout executive for the region. Grosch had been in scouting for a while as a professional, in the Las Vegas area. He has gone through the NEI courses, through and including Level 3.

Grosch knows very little about the Tobiassen affair, since he arrived after it was over. He has spoken on one occasion with Tobiassen in November or December of 1984 when he picked up some files from him. They chatted for about 30 minutes but did not discuss Tobiassen's problems. He does recall Tobiassen saying that he was sorry he was not involved in the program anymore.

Grosch said that he resigned from his position on May 1, 1986 and he was not aware of any replacement. I got the feeling that maybe he didn't work out too well in the region. I will follow up on this with Dempsey, who is out of his office until August 11.

I asked Grosch if he had heard of any other incident involving a scouting official or volunteer in his area. He said he knows of one other incident and described it for me. It appeared to be the same person that Robson had discussed with me. From what Grosch said the gentleman involved (whose name Grosch did not want to divulge because he did not consider the charges, if any, as proven) was an ordained minister whom the OTC was considering hiring as an aquatics instructor. When sent to the training program and when a medical evaluation was required as a part of that program apparently the man's doctor (from some other state besides Oregon) independently wrote to the BSA saying some very disturbing things about the minister. This was probably a breach of the physician-patient privilege but there was enough information in the letter to cause the OTC some concern and it eventually did not hire the minister.

After that Grosch next heard of this gentleman as being an assistant scoutmaster of a troop in Corvallis. Apparently the man got involved in the troop but was never registered as a leader. One of the mothers of a troop scouter called him and made some complaints about some conduct of the minister. He apparently took this complaint to the troop leaders and they confronted the scout leader/minister and apparently resolved the problem at that point.

Grosch is one of the people on Bill Barton's "list" of people he wants to depose. Though he was fully cooperative with me Grosch asked that I request a subpena be issued by Barton for any deposition appearance, i.e. he does not want to appear voluntarily. Since he is no longer our employee I can only acquiesce to that request and I have relayed it to Barton. Grosch leaves me with the impression that I can speak to him at any time and I have told him I can protect his interests in his depositions, to the extent the questions relate to a time period when he was our employee.
