There was immediate admission on his part that he had committed acts contrary to the principals of the Boy Scouts of merica and signified his immediate willingness to resign from any and all activities in Scouting. ness to resign

It is my understanding that he has requested a transfer from Fitzsimons Army Hospital to some other base.

Realizing the implications of acts in which I was involved and after consulting with certain adults in whom I can confide I feel that the following statement in regards to James Wells is necessary in order to maintain the high standards of the Scouting movement.

At the age of about 14 in April of 1964 I was approached by Jim as to going on a trip with him to the mountains. For snow shoeing. I was told that he was soint to the mountains. shoeing. I was told that he was going to take a couple of other guys along and that I would be welcome. As it turned out if was only Jim and I that went, he told me the others wouldn't be able to come because of certain changes in plans. We went up the ar Idaho Springs and on the way up he treated me to a dinner. I about 5:30 or 6:00 when we arrived at our destination of a desolate mountain road off the main highway. I tried the snowshoes while Jim remained in the car, an International with large open area in back, and then came back. We talked about different things such as Order of the Arrow, the existence of God, and the universe. Then he began talking with me about friendship and society's view of same. As time proceeded he made various physical contact with me, saying, "Let's wrestle," or just one tending to bend my arm. I began to feel very uneasy about this time, but he reassured me by again getting back to subjects of the mind such as God. Later I told him as the conversation proceeded that I had been feeling very nervous lately so he offered to give me a massage. During this time he made the first contact with my penis. Then we went to bed and had mutual masterbation. He awakened me by doing this and then placed my hand of the penigrand said that I should do the same. I hesitated so he did it himself. After it was over he apologized for the white thing and said he was very sorry. The thing that I now remember about this is that before the act he said it was wrong only because of society, and that men were not to be ruled by their society why then the change of heart and apology?

The next act occurred in September of 1964 at Brainard Lake. Jim suggested that he and I go up to Brainard Lake before the Fall Fellowship so that I could prepare my campaign. After the last episode I was besitant but I thought he was on the level this time. As I happened again while I was sleeping I was awakened by him placing his faird on my penis. In both instances he had suggested that in order to keep warm we sleep together using his heavy slashing bag over the top and my light one underneath. He said that it had been proven that one is warmer if he sleeps in the rude. Again mutual masterbation took place.

In April of 1965 Jim Wells, Fred Shissler and I went up to Camp Tahosa to survey the ice meltage on the lake. At this time Jim and I slept in one room while Fred for some reason stayed in the other. Both men allowed the door to be shut between the two rooms, but who shut it I don't know. I was sleeping on the top bunk of a double bed and Jim in a bed on the floor level. In a playful manner he tried to pull me down to his bed, but I recalled the last instance and resisted and finally he gave up. There was no act on this occasion.

During this last summer when I served on camp staff, Jim made frequent trips to camp and on one occasion he suggested that we go up into the woods and camp out for a night. He took not to the place where he had taken his Vigil ceremony. I was to take mine a few weeks later. And here again he made physical contact and performed the masterbation on me but I refused to reciprocate.

Because of my immature mind I was not able to face the true meaning of these things, and maybe I still don trunder tand them, but I do believe these things were wrong, and that a man like this should not be involved with young boys. It is for this reason that I have made this statement under no pressure from any other person, but knowing in my own mind that this statement is necessary.
