Arrested in Juvenile Court Aug. 27, 1962, continued to Sept. 25, 1962. Charged with "Contributing to the delinquency of children (2)." Convicted of disorderly conduct, fined \$50 and given 12 months sentence (which, I believe was suspended upon condition of getting help). Judge Henry told me that the case was continued to allow a psychoanalysis which he read to me over the telephone. The Psychiatrist felt difficulty was not deep seated and could be treated. I understand Mr. Culpepper is now away getting such treatment. The Troop Committee Chairman advised us of it and said he had been dismissed from troop which he wanted to give up anyway. However, nothing official has happened in over two months, so my recommendation is that you put him on confidential list to prevent future registration.

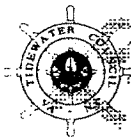

This came to my attention in a very embarrassing way, mainly through my son's wife. I felt that I have done my share of suffering because of this matter, and am very sorry the Boy Scouts were brought into this. It was not necessary.

My Attorney tells me I have grounds for legal action against the council for releasing this information to an unknown. The Police will not release this type of information to any one, why should you? I do not want to cause any more problems to the Boy Scouts than I have already done.

I would like a copy of the letter that was sent to you requesting information on me. It might be helpful in cleaning up this matter. I would also like a letter from you stating that this will not happen again. If I receive this information, I will let the matter drop as far as the Boy Scouts is concerned, if not then I will strongly consider **Legal action.**

This matter has caused me a lot of unnecessary embarrassment that I do not care to go through again. **Let the matter die.**

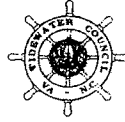



Dear Troop 362 Parent:

I am sure that by this time you have either read or heard about the articles appearing in the Wednesday editions of the Virginian-Pilot and Ledger-Star concerning certain morals charges which have been placed against Mr. Linwood M. Culpepper, a member of the Troop 362 Committee. The articles, particularly the one appearing in the Virginian-Pilot, are not only in extremely bad taste in that they specifically point out the number of our troop, the name and address of our sponsor, the Community United Methodist Church, but also the Pilot article even contained a picture of Mr. Culpepper. Because of the nature and seriousness of the allegations, which include ten separate counts of taking sexual liberties and two counts of sodomy involving some eight boys, some of whom are scouts belonging to this troop, and because the articles are extremely misleading, I and the remaining members of the Troop Committee felt it essential that we communicate with each of you immediately in order to set the record straight and to provide you with whatever information we have been able to obtain.

My personal conversation with the arresting officer, the inquiries of my colleagues on the Troop Committee, in addition to the information obtained from the parents of some of the boys involved, reveal the following facts:

(1) Contrary to the strong implications contained in the articles that the alleged offenses took place on official Troop 362 camp outs dating from last November, this is most emphatically not the case, and we have requested the newspaper to set the record straight; hopefully, this will have been done by the time you read this letter. Rather, the alleged offenses all are said to have taken place in Mr. Culpepper's camper while it was parked next to his garage or on camping trips in which boys accompanied Mr. Culpepper, most of whom reside in his neighborhood and some of whom are Troop 362 scouts.

(2) By contrast, official troop camp outs are rigidly controlled. There is always at least an Assistant Scoutmaster and/or a troop dad accompanying the Scoutmaster. The adults sleep together in a staff tent and do not sleep in the same tent with the boys. The boys must sleep in their tents and are not permitted to sleep in campers on official camp outs. Although Mr. Culpepper has brought his camper on one outing, scouts have only been permitted to load or unload supplies from it and have not been allowed in it at any other time.

(3) On every camp out in which Mr. Culpepper has accompanied the Troop, he has had very few, if any, opportunities to be alone with any scout and neither Tony LaRusso, Jim Sovocool, Bob Crispin nor Percy Patterson have seen anything untoward whatever in Mr. Culpepper's behavior. Our inquiries reveal that on the one instance in which a scout was alone with Mr. Culpepper for any appreciable period, nothing untoward occurred.

(4) Mr. Charlie Odum, a scout executive, attended our Committee meeting at my home on Wednesday night. He explained that National Scout Headquarters maintains a file on all cases of this nature involving scout leaders. If a person with a previous history of these kind of offenses subsequently registers, the unit concerned is supposed to be notified. We have been informed that Mr. Culpepper has been allegedly involved in a similar case in a nearby city some years ago, but for some reason we were not informed of this. In any event, the first inkling that I, or any of my fellow committeemen had of any charges involving Mr. Culpepper was when we opened our Virginian-Pilot on Wednesday morning. I can offer no reason why the National Headquarters warning scheme was not activated in this case.

(5) On Monday evening, Mr. Culpepper called Mr. Patterson and informed him it was necessary to immediately sever all ties with the troop. Mr. Culpepper gave no reason for his resignation and Mr. Patterson did not delve into the reasons for his decision. In any event, as of Monday evening, June 10, 1974, Mr. Culpepper is no longer associated with Troop 362 in any capacity, at his request.

(6) At the regular meeting of the troop held last night, Mr. Patterson, in his Scoutmaster's Minute, counseled the boys as to the harm which can be caused by wagging tongues and gossip, and requested that the matter not be discussed among members of the troop.

Needless to say, this entire affair must be an extremely traumatic experience for the relatively small number of boys and their families involved. Reverend Moyer, who, incidentally, attended our Committee meeting and indicated his unqualified support of the troop in general and the Committee in particular, has kindly offered to meet with any family who feels his ministry would be of assistance. If I, or any other Committee member, can be of assistance, all you have to do is ask.

It is hoped that I have answered any questions you might have had in connection with this entire affair. In the event this is not the case, you are cordially invited to a special Committee meeting next Wednesday night, 19 June, at 7:30 p.m. at the Community United Methodist Church, 1060 Kempsville Road. All Committee members who have been on camp outs with Mr. Culpepper will be in attendance, as well as the Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters. We will endeavor to answer any of your questions as frankly and completely as we know how.

In closing, let me state from the bottom of my heart that we have one of the finest troops anywhere, with a viable, hard-working Committee and a truly dedicated and outstanding Scoutmaster. In view of the fact that there is absolutely no evidence that our truly outstanding program is in any way involved in any of the allegations, outside of the fact that Mr. Culpepper has served on the Committee for some six months and that some of the boys involved happened to belong to this troop, it is our fervent hope that we don't lose one single scout as a result of this incident.

Ex-Scouter Gets Probation In Sex Case

VIRGINIA BEACH—Linwood M. Culpepper, 41, a former Kempsville Boy Scout leader, who admitted committing sexual improprieties with youngsters placed in his charge Wednesday was placed on 10 years' supervised probation.

Circuit Court Judge Austin E. Owen imposed the suspended sentences on Culpepper, guilty pleas to 10 misdemeanor sex offenses after the defense and the prosecutor agreed that the State Penitentiary was no place to send Culpepper.

"There's no help there (for Culpepper)," attorney A. Joseph Canada Jr. contended. "Sending him there would be the worst thing for him; he'd come out a worse man."

Commonwealth's Atty. Andre Evans conceded that prison would not accomplish much but that Culpepper should be kept under the court's careful supervision lest he repeat the offenses.

"Although the psychiatrist indicates that Culpepper represents no danger to society, that is no excuse for his actions," said Evans.

In fact, this was the second time that Culpepper has been charged with sexual offenses against Scouts under his supervision. In 1962, Culpepper, then a Scout leader in Norfolk, pleaded guilty to a reduced charge of disorderly conduct after he was charged with molesting two Scouts.

Culpepper, contending that he is "truly sorry for these acts," testified Wednesday that he had sought psychiatric treatment after the Norfolk incident but his psychiatrist committed suicide shortly after he entered treat-

ses—indecent liberties and sodomy—with 10 boys while on overnight camping trips.

Most of the boys belonged to his Troop 362 at Community United Methodist Church, 1060 Kempsville Road, though the outings were not sponsored by the troop.

Defense attorney Canada pleaded with the court to reduce the charges to misdemeanors so Culpepper would not lose his job.

Judge Owen agreed with Canada and reduced the indecent liberties charges to contributing to the delinquency of a minor. He suspended a 10-year prison sentence against Culpepper and placed him on probation for a like period. The judge also continued generally the two sodomy charges against Culpepper.

As conditions of his probation, Judge Owen said that Culpepper must continue in psychotherapy until released by his psychiatrist and "take no leadership or any supervisory position with youth groups of any kind."

In the earlier Norfolk case, a judge had also forbidden him to return to scouting.

Culpepper, described in a presentence report as a good father with two children, said he had even sold his home in his old Kempsville neighborhood after the recent charges. Some of the Scouts' parents lived nearby and "were upset" about the offenses, he testified.

"I realize the seriousness of the acts and I am truly sorry that the events took place," he told the judge.

Probation officer Julia Oates, who recommended that probation be considered in the case, testified that she supervises other sex offenders "and never had difficulties with them."

by and Canada would not object to Adams' hearsay evidence.

● Sentencing would be delayed until the background report is prepared.

Culpepper was arrested June 9 and accused of morals offenses against eight members of Scout Troop 362 at Community United Methodist Church as well as two other boys whom he supervised on camping expeditions in the Virginia Beach area during a six-month period from November 1973 to June 1974.

As the boys, aged 11 through 13, and their parents looked on, Adams, the investigating officer in the case, discussed the information he received during interviews with each of the boys. Adams' testimony also included the findings of an interview he had with Culpepper on the day of arrest.

"He (Culpepper) said he did fondle the boys, that he had emotional problems and that he was going to contact his psychiatrist," said Adams. "I asked him about the sodomy charges and he said, 'Yes, I probably did that.'"

It was the second such case in which Culpepper has been involved. In 1962 he was accused of child molestation against two members of a Norfolk Scout troop, police reports indicate. He

was convicted of disorderly conduct, court records show.

The mother of one of the two Norfolk Scouts has said that the charge was reduced on condition that Culpepper receive psychiatric treatment and not again participate in Boy Scout activities.

At the conclusion of Tuesday's trial, Evans thanked the parents for attending and bringing their sons. He told the parents that there would be no need for them to appear at the sentencing, but several indicated that their interest in the case had not concluded.

"I'd like to know (when sentencing will take place)," one father told Evans. "I'd like to attend."
