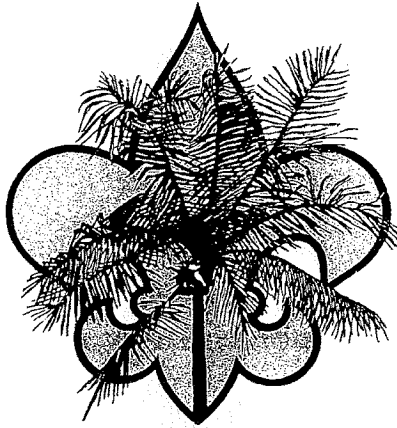

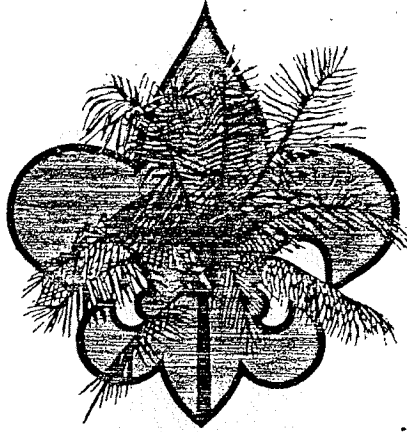

MEMORANDUM

May 11, 1978

SUBJECT: MEETING WITH [REDACTED] IN REFERENCE TO  
JAMES BUSH'S APPLICATION AS SCOUTMASTER OF  
TROOP 169

Yesterday I met with [REDACTED], Principal of Wingate Oaks Center, at 4:00 p.m. at the Holiday Inn, Intersection of State Road 84 and I-95, to share with him the letter from Paul Ernst in regard to the National Office's refusal to accept Mr. Bush's application.

I outlined in the beginning of our conversation that I was simply bringing him up-to-date in regard to the letter and informing him of his duties as the head of a sponsoring institution. Those duties, as sponsor, include furnishing a meeting place and providing leadership. He stated that he was only asked to provide a meeting place as the leadership obligation was never discussed by Mr. Bush.

After reviewing the letter, I informed him that as head of the sponsoring institution he had the authority to replace Mr. Bush if he so desired. He immediately said that he could not make a decision based on the letter and his lack of knowledge of his duties as sponsor.

He added that his school was located in a high-crime area and that he had good relations with the community people and desired to maintain those good relations. He also expressed a fear of reprisal against the school if he asked Mr. Bush to resign. I thanked him for his interest and time as sponsor and as a Webelos leader and father of a Webelos Scout and concluded by asking him to keep our conversation confidential. He agreed to do so as we left.

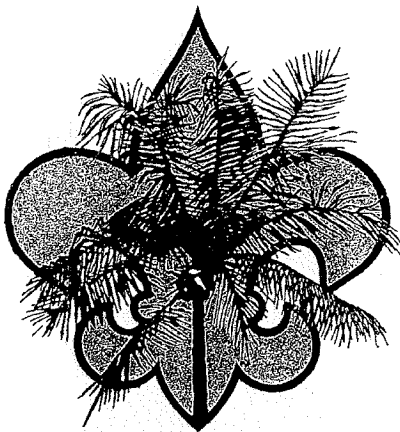

## He's Found Innocent

Bush was convicted in 1974 of assaulting a 7-year-old boy in his charge during a Boy Scout camp-out in Lauderdale. He was charged with sexual molestation after the boy told his parents he had been attacked by Bush while they and three other members of Fort Lauderdale Troop 332 slept in a tent at a wooded Lauderdale campsite.

The boy's parents notified Lauderdale police, who questioned other troop members at the campsite. One 13-year-old boy said he had also been attacked on a previous occasion by Bush. The boy later recanted that testimony, saying he had lied and that Bush may just have been rolling over in his sleep when he bumped against him.

Bush had no record of homosexual activity. At the time of his arrest, he was engaged to a Pompano Beach woman.

AT THE SEPTEMBER 1974 trial, the prosecution's doctor found no evidence the victim had been attacked. Bush said his lawyer did not call the many character witnesses he requested.

After the six-member jury found Bush guilty,

Circuit Judge M. Daniel Futch Jr. sentenced Bush to 12 years' hard labor of a 15-year maximum sentence. An appeal in November 1975 was unsuccessful.

After the appeal failed, however, 13-year-old boy recanted his testimony and Public Defender William Herring took over the case.

A new trial took place early this year. After the trial, Judge Futch and the Broward State Attorney's Office agreed that Bush would go free if he could pass a lie detector test. Bush took the test Monday and was released from jail Tuesday.

The 10th-grade dropout, whose case was championed by several members of his church group, criticized some of the people involved in his initial trial, including Judge Futch and his former attorney, Norman Zimmerman.

Futch was not available for comment on the case. Zimmerman, who was charged with "incompetency" in a review petition filed by Bush's new attorney, had no comment Wednesday. He said he could not remember if he had directed Bush not to take a lie detector test before his first trial in 1974.

## Jailed, He's Found Innocent

James Bush, a 27-year-old former scoutmaster who spent more than five months in jail convicted of a homosexual assault the court now says he never committed, enjoyed his first full day of real freedom Wednesday after he passed a lie detector test and charges against him were dropped.

Bush said his first thoughts were to regain the \$3.75-hourly job driving a school bus he lost two years ago because of the charges.

But he also said he was bitter over what he called a 30-month ordeal to prove his innocence.

"I want to forgive the people who sent me to jail," Bush said, "and yet I feel bitter that justice was not done.

"RIGHT NOW, I just want to clear my name. I don't know if I want to be a scoutmaster again, but I want them (the Boy Scouts) to know about this incident. I feel the School Board should give me my job back," Bush said.

## Man Wrongly Convicted of Assault to Seek Scout Post

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (UPI) — A former Boy Scout Master, convicted of sexual assault on a 7-year-old member of his troop nearly two years ago and released from jail this week after passing a lie detector test, says he will seek reinstatement in the Boy Scouts.

James Bush, 27, said Wednesday he would try to return to the life he led prior to his September, 1974 conviction.

"I just hope to try and get my job back as a school bus driver and get the Boy Scouts to reinstate me and to clear my name," he said.

Public defender William Herring has filed a motion to expunge Bush's prison record. He served a total of four and a half months of a 12-year prison sentence.

Bush, Scout Master of troop 332, was convicted Sept. 18, 1974 of sexual assault on a youngster during a November, 1973 campout. The boy, one of four to share a tent with Bush, told his parents he had been sexually attacked. During police questioning of the other youngsters in the tent, a 13-year-old said Bush had molested him in a previous campout.

An appeal of the conviction was rejected and Bush returned to prison at a Tallahassee road camp until Herring won a new hearing in January before Circuit Judge Daniel Futch.

Herring had obtained a statement from the 13-year-old boy in which the boy admitted he had lied to police and that all Bush did was bump up against him in his sleep. Under questioning in the hearing, the youngster was uncertain about his original story and the statement.

The judge decided to give Bush a lie

detector test, saying if Bush passed he could go free but if he failed he would serve the full 12-year sentence.

Bush passed the test and was freed Monday.

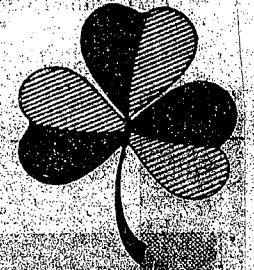

Because of Judge Futch's order yesterday, Bush won't have to return to shoveling in the hot sun as a member of an heavily guarded inmate work crew out of the Tallahassee Road Prison.

A 10th-grade dropout and volunteer worker for the state Division of Youth Services, Bush was scoutmaster of Troop 332 in northwest Fort Lauderdale when the group went on a campout on Nov. 16, 1973, in a wooded area near the 6700 block of NW 45th Street in Lauderdale.

After the usual talk of snipe hunts and such, the

boys bedded down for the night in several tents. Bush had four boys in his tent, including the 7-year-old boy whose father Bush had asked earlier the day to take home because the boy was ill.

The boy was taken home the following day, which time he told his mother he had been sexually attacked. His parents summoned police.

Bush, who was living with his mother and family and was engaged to a 23-year-old Pompano Beach woman, had no record of homosexual activity, and in fact was known among his acquaintances, they testified later, as a dedicated religious activist.

# Lie Test Frees Scout Master In Sex Case

Police arrived at the campsite on the afternoon of Nov. 17, taking the boys who had slept in Bush's tent the previous night one by one into a squad car for questioning. A 13-year-old said Bush had molested him at a similar campsite six weeks earlier.

In the 10 months before his case went to trial, Bush said he wanted to take a lie test and waited for police to give him a polygraph examination, but that they never did.

Bogenschutz, however, said that the day before the Sept. 18, 1974, trial, Bush was offered and refused a lie detector test.

At any rate, the six-member jury deliberated only about two hours before finding him guilty.

Bush couldn't understand it, he said. The prosecution's doctor found no evidence that the victim was attacked. Bush's attorney, Norman D. Zimmerman, did not call the many character witnesses Bush had asked him to use, despite the \$500 fee, Bush said.

Then on Oct. 24, Judge Futch sentenced Bush to 12 years at hard labor, almost the 15-year maximum for a first offense.

Bush went to jail until mid-December when a \$5,000 appeal bond set him free. He was free until Nov. 17, 1975, when the Fourth District Court of Appeals found nothing wrong with the original trial and denied his appeal. He was then sent to prison.

Bush's appeal was led by a Wilton Manors woman and about 100 Bush partisans from black and white churches, she said, who did the leg work going over Bush's case.

Crucial to the appeal was the 13-year-old boy who claimed Bush had sexually assaulted him six weeks before the 7-year-old boy was allegedly assaulted.

The 13-year-old youth subsequently recanted his testimony and signed a statement saying:

"At the trial for Mr. Bush I lied and said that Mr. Bush had tried to do something like this to me when we were on another camping trip once. I really don't know that he meant to do anything like this. All that I remember is that Mr. Bush bumped up against me. He may just have been rolling over in his sleep."

Although the appellate court denied the appeal, though one judge wondered why Bush was sent to prison instead of a mental hospital, Herring took over the case from Zimmerman and, armed with the new testimony from the 13-year-old boy, filed a motion asking Futch to vacate the sentence.

And in his 28-page petition, Herring charged Zimmerman with "gross incompetency" by allegedly not preparing the defense sufficiently and not safeguarding Bush's rights during the trial. So, in mid-January this year, Bush was taken from prison to the county jail to await the hearing.

"I got to thinking about the 13-year-old's new testimony. It must have carried a lot of weight with the jury, so I thought the guy (Bush) should have a new hearing," Futch said today.

With a packed courtroom of Bush activists looking on — and this time all the witnesses were called — Futch took a strong role in questioning witnesses as Asst. State Atty. James L. Coan remained almost silent.

Under questioning by the judge, the 13-year-old youth seemed to go back to his original story of an alleged attack, but Futch reserved ruling to ponder the case.

Then last week Futch and Bogenschutz called Herring and said Bush could go free if he passed the polygraph examination, though the judge said he would send Bush back to prison for the full 12 years if he failed.

Bush was hesitant to take the test, according to Bogenschutz, and asked to think about it over the weekend.

"It kind of amazed me that he wanted to think it over. He had nothing to lose by taking it and everything to gain — his freedom — if he did," Bogenschutz said.

Bush consented and passed the test with ease. Officials said Bush

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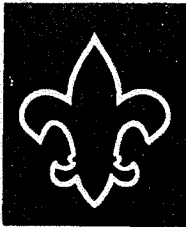
