Man to serve 20 years for sex crimes

BAY ST. LOUIS, Miss. — A Louisiana real estate agent and former Boy Scout camp employee was sentenced to 20 years in prison after being found guilty of committing sexual battery twice on a Metairie youth working as a junior counselor at a Mississippi scout camp.

A Circuit Court jury in Bay St. Louis deliberated an hour and 20 minutes Thursday before returning a guilty verdict against Steve Allen Adams, 33, of Shreve, La.

Judge Kosta Vlahos sentenced Adams to 10 years on each of the two charges.

Officials said the victim of the July 1987 attacks was a high school senior from Metairie.

■ BAY ST. LOUIS — A Shreve, La., real estate agent and former Boy Scout camp employee faces a 20-year prison sentence after being convicted of committing sexual battery twice on a junior camp counselor in July 1987.

The jury deliberated about an hour and 20 minutes Thursday before returning a guilty verdict against Steve Allen Adams, 33.

Circuit Court Judge Kosta Vlahos immediately sentenced Adams to 10 years each on the two charges, to run consecutively.

The victim, a 5-foot 2-inch high school senior in Metairie, La., said he had attended summer camp at Salmen Scout Reservation north of Kiln in Hancock County since 1984.

On July 26, 1987, he said, he was working as a "counselor in training" during Cub Scout camp.

After a campfire that evening, he said, he went to the camp's health lodge, where camp staff members customarily gathered.

There, he said, he was subjected to two bouts of hazing during which Adams rubbed him with mayonnaise, mustard, liniment and other items.

The procedure, called "attitude adjustment" at the camp, was not an unusual occurrence and did not worry him, he said.

But later, he said, he became frightened when Adams offered him a ride to pick up clean clothes and then, instead of returning to the health lodge, drove him to an area called "the clay pits."

"He asked me some personal (sexual) questions. I started getting scared and worried, because I didn't know what was going to happen."

The youth said that Adams fondled him, performed oral sex on him and tried to force him to perform oral sex on Adams.

He did not try to run away, he said, because Adams was "a lot bigger," and because he did not know the woods well enough to flee.

Adams, who took the stand in his own defense, denied molesting the boy. It was another staff member, he said, who suggested that the youth be given an "attitude adjustment."

Adams, who owns Gulf State Collections Inc., raises rabbits and operates a shrimp boat, said he also is a certified emergency medical technician.

He had worked for Boy Scouts of America for about five years and had assisted with the summer camp program for three. His responsibilities included operating the mini-hospital and helping the Scouts earn merit badges in health.

After Adams' conviction, most of the jurors remained in court for the sentencing. They did not learn until then that Adams had a prior conviction in California for a homosexual offense.

STEVE ADAMS WAS RELEASED FROM EMPLOYMENT BY THE NEW ORLEANS AREA COUNCIL AT THE 1987 SUMMER CAMP. REASON FOR HIS DISMISSAL WAS FOR LEAVING CAMP OVERNIGHT, WITH ANOTHER STAFF MEMBER, WITHOUT THE PERMISSION OF THE CAMP DIRECTOR.

AFTER ADAMS RELEASE, IT WAS REPORTED THAT ADAMS HAD SEXUALLY MOLESTED A 15 YEAR OLD STAFF MEMBER. THE LOCATION OF THE ALLEGED MOLESTATION OCCURRED AT CAMP SALMEN SCOUT RESERVATION HANCOCK COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI IN THE HEALTH LODGE IN A REMOTE SECTION OF CAMP. ADAMS POSITION AT CAMP WAS ASSISTANT HEALTH OFFICER. AS OF THIS WRITING, CHARGES HAVE BEEN PRESSED. ADAMS HAS BEEN ARRESTED IN HOUMA, LOUISIANA AND AWAITS EXTRADITION TO MISSISSIPPI TO FACE CHARGES.

THE FACTS:

[REDACTED], 30s, single, of Schriever, La., health lodge director at the New Orleans Area Council's Salmen Scout Reservation, Hancock County, MS, has been dismissed from his paid summer camp staff position and from his registered BSA position as a district camping chairman.

Acting on rumors, the camp leadership has allegedly ascertained that [REDACTED] performed oral copulation on a 15-year-old Scout at the camp on Monday, July 27. The BSA has conferred with the youth and his parents, and has turned over its information to the Jefferson (LA) Parish Sheriff's office. NO CHARGES HAVE BEEN FILED AS OF THIS DATE.

According to Hegwood, [REDACTED] had been inviting campers to "attitude adjustment" sessions whereby he performed massages with a combination of various oils and other lubricants. No complaints came to the attention of the camp staff, but when rumors developed the matter was referred to the camp chaplain who allegedly reported back that there were no problems. The July 27 situation came to light after some camp staff members apparently watched one of the "attitude adjustment" sessions, and after Adams is alleged to have lured the youth to a remote area of the camp for additional "fun."

ACTION OR RECOMMENDATIONS:

Hegwood is well aware of the very serious morals situation in New Orleans Council a decade ago, which he says still is a handicapping stigma to the council there. He says things are "very fragile" and fears any media exposure will be a disaster to Scouting locally. He is hoping if and when charges are filed that they may not come to the media's attention. He has been advised to say as little as possible to the media beyond our usual confirmation of BSA position and the fact that [REDACTED] has been removed from all Scouting affiliation. He has been advised to refer callers to the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office.

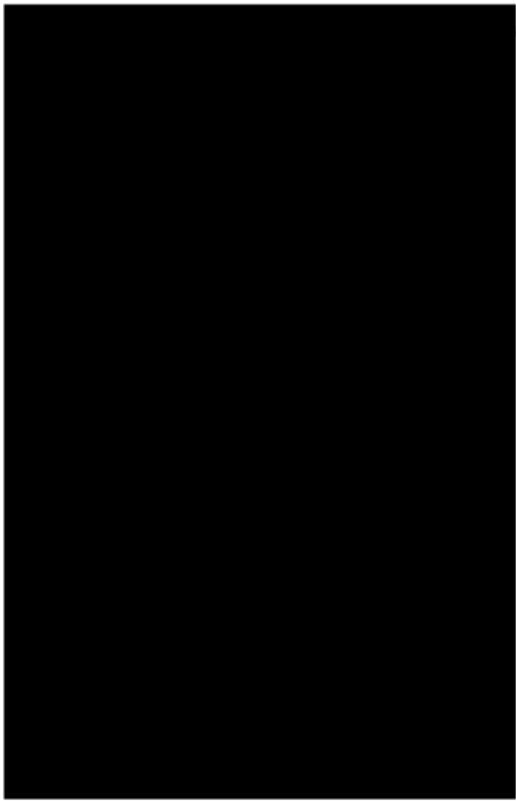

Dear Deborah:

I enclose herewith Mr. Ron Hegwood's chronology of events relative to the Steve Adams matter. You will also find the letter which Mr. Hegwood has written to Mr. Steve Adams advising him of the termination of his services. Mr. Hegwood has further advised the parents of the youths involved of the concern of the Boy Scouts and of the willingness to offer counselling and any other services. Mr. Hegwood has reported the matter to the authorities in Hancock County, Mississippi and in Jefferson Parish, Louisiana. On August 28th, Mr. Hegwood advised me that the parents of one of the youngsters involved whose last name is [redacted] were speaking with Lt. Rushing of the Kenner, Louisiana police department. Thereafter they were going to discuss the matter with the sheriff of Hancock County, Mississippi.

With respect to the media, I have suggested that all inquiries from the media be turned over to me. I, of course, intend to advise any media person that we do not discuss our clients affairs with the press.

It was indeed a happy pleasure to speak with you and I hope that this matter will resolve without injury or damage to the Boy Scouts.


Dear Mr. Adams:

John Meeks provided the following details that allegedly occurred the evening of Sunday, July 26, 1987.

- (A) Adams gave Staff member "B" a rub down called an attitude adjustment in the Health Lodge. The rub down was viewed by several Staff members including [REDACTED] and Camp Chaplain Robert C. Rogers.
- (B) Later that evening Adams lured Staff member "B" to a remote area of camp and allegedly sexually molested the Staff member--including oral sex.
- (C) The details of this incident were told to Bobby Bennett by Staff member "B" with a promise of confidentiality. Bennett passed on the information to James Inabinet again asking for confidentiality. Following the discussion with John Meeks, Johnny Sneed and I met with Bobby Bennett. Bennett denied Mrs. [REDACTED] story, acted surprised at the information. Under questioning about the Steve Adams and Staff member "B" matter, Bennett acknowledged that he had viewed the rub down in the Health Lodge and that he had become concerned later in the evening as to the whereabouts of Adams and Staff member "B". Because of this concern, Bennett and Chaplain Robert Rogers searched the camp for Adams and found them in an area called the "clay pit". Upon approaching this area, Steve Adams and Staff Member "B" met them on the trail and Bennett provided a ride back to camp for Staff member "B". In the conversation, Bennett denied knowledge of details of what might have occurred between Adams and Staff member "B". Following this meeting we met with Staff member "A". He acknowledged that he had seen Mrs. [REDACTED] at the Health Lodge

but denied wrongdoings. When asked why he had wrapped himself in a sheet upon seeing Mrs. [REDACTED], he could not give a logical explanation.

Following this interview, I talked to the Camp Chaplain Robert Rogers. Rogers indicated that he felt that certain things were going on at camp that were not acceptable. However, he pleaded confidentiality as a chaplain. He acknowledged that he had viewed the rub down on Sunday evening. Rogers could not give an adequate response as to why he had not reported this incident other than to say that it was an initiation. He would not shed any light on the encounter at the "clay pit".

Following the discussion with Rogers, we attempted to locate Staff member "B" and was told that he had left camp to return to New Orleans.

Friday, July 31.

- I telephoned Council President Fred Nodier and later that day he returned my call and I provided pertinent details.
- I attempted to contact Bill Porteous. He returned my call on two occasions but we were unable to make connections.
- I telephoned the National Council Boy Scouts of America. Attempted to discuss matter with attorney Dave Park and was referred to Debra in the Risk Management Department. Debra advised on procedures including notification of authorities, counseling available for Scouts and other recommendations.
- Contacted Children Protection Hotline in Jefferson Parish at 838-5345. I was told that they did not get involved unless it was inter-family molestation. They referred me to the juvenile authorities in Jefferson Parish.

- o Telephoned Staff member "B" at his home to discuss the matter with him prior to involving his parents. Staff member "B" would only acknowledge that the rub down had occurred in the Health Lodge and that it was viewed by several staff members. I indicated to him that I had additional information but he refused to acknowledge anything other than the rub down. He said he would be returning to camp with his dad later in the day to secure personal gear, etc. I requested he have a discussion with his dad en route to camp and to confide in him. He agreed to do this and also agreed to telephone me on Tuesday, August 4. (Saturday and Sunday I was in Houston, Texas helping to relocate my daughter).

Monday, August 3: I arrived at the office and was met by John Meeks. John had met with Staff member "B" at camp on Friday afternoon. "B" alleged that Steve Adams molested him in the "clay pit" area of camp. Following the attitude adjustment in the Health Lodge, Adams drove "B" to the Staff area for a change of clothes and then suggested that he drive Staff member "B" back to the Health Lodge. Instead of returning to the Health Lodge Adams drove to the family camping area. At this point, "B" protested using the excuse that he had to go to the restroom. Adams, at that point, drove to the family latrine area and positioned the truck in such a manner that Staff member "B" could not escape. Following the stop at the latrine, Adams then drove to the clay pit area. Upon arriving at the clay pit area, Adams fondled "B" while in the truck. During the fondling, an auto approached occupied by Camp Chaplain Robert Rogers and Bobby Bennett. Adams commented to "B" that Bobby Bennett was probably looking for a place to park. Bobby and Chaplain Rogers left the area and Steve Adams and "B" left the truck and went to the clay pit. Steve Adams performed oral sex on Staff member "B": Staff member "B" was unable to get an erection. Adams became frustrated with this and asked Staff member "B" to perform oral sex on him. Staff member "B" performed this act for less than a minute. Finally, Adams

applied a lubricate to ●s thighs and asked Staff memb ● "B" to get on top of him. Staff member "B" again, could not get an erection. Rogers and Bennett returned to the scene. At that time, Adams told Staff member "B" to put his pants on and they approached the car. Staff member "B" returned to camp in the automobile with Bennett and the chaplain returned with Adams. Following this disclosure, John Meeks discussed the details with Johnny Sneed in New Orleans. They made a determination that they should wait until I returned from Houston to meet with the parents. Circumstances developed; however, that forced a meeting between Johnny Sneed, John Meeks, Staff member "B" and his parents in Metairie on Saturday evening. Following this discussion with John Meeks on Monday, August 3, I carried out the following actions:

1. Notified Juvenile Authorities in Jefferson Parish. First attempted to discuss the matter with Sheriff Harry Lee who was unavailable and was referred to Captain Fred Williams, Juvenile Department. Captain Williams indicated this would be in the jurisdiction of Hancock County. He subsequently talked to the authorities in Hancock County.

Sheriff Ronnie Peterson, Hancock County called and we discussed the alleged molestation. Sheriff Peterson and I agreed that I would contact the parents of Staff member "B" and provide them with the Sheriff's telephone number in Hancock County. I contacted the father of Staff member "B" at his office and he requested a meeting at 1:00 P.M.

- Both parents of Staff member "B" met with me to discuss the implications of pressing charges. Their primary concern was the protection of their son. They expressed a desire to punish Steve Adams, but stated that the decision to press charges was essentially their son's.

We discussed counseling and I committed to providing a recommendation of potential counselors. ~~The parents appeared to be reasonable people with the primary concern being the welfare of their son. of potential~~ counselors. The parents appeared to be reasonable people with the

primary concern being the welfare of their . I indicated to the parents that I planned no further involvement in this matter pending their decision to press charges. I also stated that we would support their decision regardless of the course of action. Later that day I called the father and provided the name of two counselors.

Monday evening, I telephoned camp to discuss the situation with James Inabinet. He provided the names of two additional minor age Staff members who allegedly received "attitude adjustments" at camp. This consisted of rub downs using Ben Gay, etc.

Wednesday, August 5

- ° Telephoned Sheriff Peterson of Hancock County. He indicated that the County would not investigate the matter or carry out any action unless the parents pressed charges. I attempted to get an opinion regarding the possibilities of a conviction. The Sheriff refused to speculate on this other than to say that in most cases the jury supports the minor's story. He also indicated that Mississippi has a fondling law which applies to youth under 15 years of age. The information to-date does not involve anyone under 15.
- ° Telephoned the father of "B". No decision on pressing charges.
- ° Telephoned National BSA office--up-dated Debra Duhs.
- ° Talked to parents of Staff member "D" (identified by James Inabinet) mother was aware that her son went through the "attitude adjustment". She is convinced that nothing else occurred. (I provided no details on other matters.) She indicated that her son had a tremendous experience at camp and is extremely interested in serving on Staff next summer.
- ° Talked to mother of Staff member "C"--left word for "C" to telephone me on Thursday evening.

Thursday, August 6

- Talked by telephone to father of "B". He indicated that "B" was scheduled for a counseling session on Friday morning (August 7). The family will make a decision on pressing charges on August 7 or two weeks from now upon returning from vacation. I offered continued support.
- Telephone call from "C"--he stated that he had not gone through an attitude adjustment session but was aware that these sessions occurred. He could not identify anyone who had gone through the session.

Tuesday, August 4

- A. Accompanied by John Meeks and Johnny Sneed, I drove to Schriever, Louisiana and delivered a letter to Steve Adams dismissing him from the program of the Boy Scouts of America. In addition, Adams had served as a volunteer caretaker for a fishing camp located near Cutoff, Louisiana and owned by the council. I secured the keys to the camp. Adams asked for the details of this dismissal but I did not elaborate.
- B. Rick Bachmann telephoned and I briefed him on the situation. Rick thought that I should continue a discreet investigation interviewing anyone that might have been implicated.
- C. Following my conversation with Bachmann, I telephoned the National Office for advice. After a lengthy discussion, it was determined that I should follow up with any other parties that had been implicated.
- D. I telephoned the homes of two minors--both Staff members (approximately 15 years of age). Both boys had allegedly received an "attitude adjustment" from Adams which consisted of a rub down with Ben Gay, etc.
Staff member "C" was not at home. Staff member "D"--No answer.

SUMMARY THOUGHTS

1. During the employment of Steve Adams, Larry Enlow expressed a concern that Adams was in his mid-thirties and not married. Camp Director Eric Howell, who knew Steve down played this concern and he was hired on the basis that there was no hint of impropriety. He is a trained emergency medical technician.

2. I am concerned about the actions of Chaplain Robert Rogers. John Meeks picked up a rumor the last week of camp regarding the attitude adjustment sessions. John did not have the details of what was happening, but followed up with Chaplain Rogers and he was assured that there was nothing to be concerned about.

Eric Howell also became aware of the attitude adjustment sessions in the 4th week of camp. This matter was brought to Eric's attention by a Staff member who had gone through an attitude adjustment session. Eric followed up with Steve Adams at this time and instructed him to immediately stop this practice.

In my opinion, neither Eric nor John had sufficient details to be overly concerned about these matters prior to Thursday, July 30 when details started to unfold. As a matter of fact, they were under the impression that the attitude adjustment implied using pressure point control, etc.

3. I am convinced that I made a mistake in the designation of the two camp directors for the summer session. Eric Howell served for 3 weeks and John Meeks served 3 weeks. In retrospect, this arrangement eroded the authority figure of the Camp Director and allowed a master manipulator like Steve Adams to seize an opportunity. I can find no serious fault in their actions.
