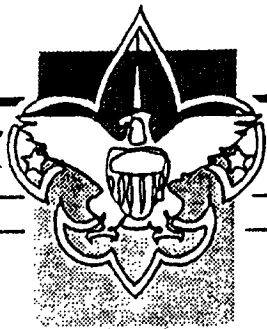

Dear Paul:

In 1988 Jere Ratcliffe and I decided to take a pro-active posture reference to adults that we permit to have the opportunity of working in our council. As a result, we have learned of a few people that are of a questionable nature, but yet, we do not have sufficient facts to terminate their registration.

In addition to the people that are currently registered and have not been terminated, there are those individuals that we have files for which the individuals were registered in the past but are not currently registered. Our legal counsel has advised us to be on the alert in the event that they might attempt to register in the future with our council and/or any other council. Our legal counsel has requested that we share what information we have with you with the hopes that you could prevent their registering with any council.

WILLIAM BURRIS

White male. DOB: 9/4/54. Last known address: Olathe, KS. Local law enforcement reported on March 11, 1986 that Burris had been involved in child pornography and the Scouting program in the Wichita area. While in Wichita, Burris was involved in hard core child pornography. In March 1986, Burris was employed at computer center near Truman Corner's Shopping Center, Grandview, Missouri. In March 1986, Burris was not registered.

WILLIE LIGANS

December 1989, a security officer of the Veteran's Administration Hospital, Kansas City, Missouri reported that Ligans was attempting to organize an Explorer Post at the hospital. Security officer stated that kiddie porn had been located in Ligan's apartment. Ligan's was not registered and executive staff was not familiar with any efforts to organize an Explorer Post at the hospital.

STEVEN TOMPKINS

In early 1980, Tompkins was convicted of firing a pistol into a pickup truck. Investigation reflected that possibly this had occurred at another time and Tompkins had possibly physically abused his wife. In the late 1980's, Tompkins moved to St. Claire County Missouri and resided by himself. In the late 1980's Tompkins was not registered.

JOHN KEN ENENBAUCH

On June 25, 1990, an anonymous phone call reported that Enenbauch had abused brother's of the caller, his sons and stepsons. The caller had become aware of alleged abuses two years ago. Caller would not provide her name and indicated she would call later. As of this date, no additional information has been provided. Enenbauch was not registered with BSA.

LAWRENCE N. ALLEN

not registered

August 11, 1978, Allen was charged with molesting a 13 year old Boy Scout at Camp Naish, Bonner Springs, Kansas; Heart of America Council. Allen, a Chicago resident, was visiting his parents in Lenexa, Kansas, for the summer. Allen was not a camp employee nor was he registered with this council. Allen was charged with indecent liberties with a minor and aggravated assault with a vehicle.

DONALD EUGENE BAKER

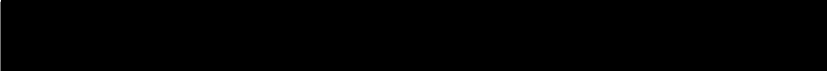

Indecent liberty charge on man

A 20-year-old Chicago man was arraigned today in Wyandotte County District Court in connection with a July 4 incident at Camp Naish, Bonner Springs, involving a 13-year-old Johnson County boy.

Lawrence Allen was charged Monday with one count of indecent liberties with a minor and one count of aggravated assault with a vehicle.

A preliminary hearing has been set for Aug. 15.

According to Bonner Springs Police Chief Robert Kroh, the boy and a companion were walking along a road on the camp grounds when Allen allegedly drove up in an automobile, forced the victim into a nearby wooded area, took his pants off and began taking pictures of him. The other boy ran from the scene, police said.

The boy was able to run from the man and his cries for help were heard by scout masters who gave chase to the man who attempted to flee in his vehicle.

Police said camp counselors held the man until police arrived. There were no witnesses to the incident, police said.
