Dear Jim:

I am writing this letter to you concerning the situation that occurred in my life June 24, 1988. I am sure that you heard. I was falsely accused of fondling a 6 year old neighbor child. After consulting with three attorney's, a judge, and getting advise from the District Attorney through my attorney; I agreed to admit I did something I did not do. The reason for this is as follows:

All the above mentioned individuals advised me that if I went to court to prove my innocence I would have a fifty-fifty chance of winning. This would mean if I lost I could get 2 - 10 years plus a \$1,000.00 to \$10,000.00 fine, but if I settled out of court I could get a suspended sentence and my case would be non-adjudicated, which means I would have no record. Also, if the case went to trial it would have been November before a trial date was set and could have been six to eight months before it went to trial. How can anyone survive this long without a job? With a wife and two children of my own, which option would you have taken?

Now that you know what transpired and how I settled this traumatic ordeal I would like to express my feelings on how I was treated by the Boy Scouts of America. After eight and one-half years of loyal service and never even a rumor that I might do something such as this I was given a letter putting me on immediate leave of absence with NO pay. I was told that I would have to prove my innocence beyond a shadow of a doubt before the Boy Scouts of America would consider me for re-employment. I was by the Boy Scouts of America GUILTY until proven innocent. I grew up hearing you are innocent until proven guilty beyond a shadow of doubt. I guess this belief is not one that the Boy Scouts of America believe in when dealing with one of there employees.

Jim, nine and one-half years ago in January of 1979 I made a decision to leave a job I had held for nine years, moved my wife and daughter and returned to college to finish my education. This decision was made for one reason. I had talked with a professional scouter and he had sold me on going to work for the Boy Scouts of America, but I needed a degree to do so. Now nine and one-half years later I have been treated like a step-child by the organization I believed in an dedicated eight and one-half years of my life to serve. Volunteers in the Pine Burr Area Council, from the President down to Unit Leaders have supported me 100%. They have called to give support, offered money to help with legal fees and now they are giving me high recommendations for jobs. Has any professional scouter other than Harry Bynum and some of my co-workers ever called? NO! Has any Area, Regional, or National professional called to see if I need help, are if they could help with recommendations? NO! What does this say for an organization that supposedly believes in God, Family and the American Way? NOT MUCH!! Has any professionals even suggested we get together to discuss this matter and see if I might be able to return to work for the Boy Scouts of America, an organization I still love? NO! I would reapply for my job with the Boy Scouts of America, but you know and I know there is no way they will ever re-employ me. So, why prolong something that will never happen.

Let me close at this time for I feel the more I write the more upset I get thinking about the way I have been treated. Let me just say: On my HONOR, I will do my BEST, to do by DUTY, to GOD and my COUNTRY, to obey the Scout law, to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and MORALLY straight, the motto I have lived by during my time with the Boy Scouts of America.

Dear Mr. Curry:

Allegations have been made against you of a violation of Section 97-5-23, Mississippi Code 1972, as amended. Such conduct is of a very serious nature and, if verified, is in violation of the personnel policies of the Boy Scouts of America and subjects you to immediate termination. While these matters are being investigated by BSA, you are placed on suspension effective this date. Your salary ceases immediately. Benefits will continue as before until a determination of termination or reinstatement has been reached. Contributory benefits will continue if you so elect by continuing your personal contributions; otherwise, they will cease the last day of the current month. If investigation substantiates the allegations made, your termination will be effective retroactive to the date of this suspension.
