Man sentenced 18 months for sexually molesting girls

A Funkstown man who pleaded guilty in October to sexually molesting two young girls during the summer of 1987 was sentenced this morning to 18 months in the Washington County Detention Center.

Fred Thomas Ebberts, 46, of 1 South High St., Funkstown, could have faced a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison on each of two counts of third-degree sexual offense.

And Washington County Circuit Judge Fred Wright said he would have been harsher had there been any evidence that Ebberts forced himself on the two girls.

Wright ordered Ebberts to continue counseling and pay \$421 in restitution for the costs of counseling for one of the victims. Ebberts was placed on probation for three years.

At the October hearing, the events on several nights in June and July of 1987 were detailed. The girls, who were 12 and 13 at that time, were spending the night at the home of one girl's grandparents when they got into a liquor cabinet

and became intoxicated, according to police reports.

They had left the grandparents' home and gone to a spring house on the property when Ebberts came in and engaged in touching and fondling the girls and attempted to have sex with them, according to police reports.

After that night, the girls apparently called Ebberts and invited him over again. There were subsequent sexual encounters at the grandparents' home and at Ebberts' home in Funkstown, police reports showed.

The incidents came to light in

Ebberts came to the Maryland State Police barracks and admitted to Tfc. Michael Potter he had fondled the girls and attempted to have sex with them. He also admitted he knew in 1987 that the girls were very young.

This morning, Ebberts cried softly and apologized for the incidents.

Wright said he didn't sentence Ebberts to prison because there was no evidence of force and Ebberts was candid about the events and pleaded guilty, thus eliminating the need for the victims to testify in court.

Man pleads uilty to molesting girls

A Funkstown man who pleaded guilty yesterday to sexually molesting two young girls during the summer of 1987 is free on \$15,000 bond pending completion of a pre-sentence investigation.

Fred Thomas Ebberts, 46, of 1 South High St., Funkstown, could face a maximum sentence of 10 years on each of two counts of third-degree sexual offense. He appeared before Washington County Circuit Judge Frederick C. Wright III yesterday.

In exchange for the guilty plea, charges of second-degree rape, assault with intent to rape and second-degree sexual offenses were dropped.

The girls, who were 12 and 13 at that time, were spending the night at the home of one girl's grand-parents when they got into a liquor cabinet and became intoxicated, according to police reports.

They had left the grandparents' home and gone to a spring house on the property when Ebberts came in and engaged in touching and fondling the girls and attempting sexual intercourse, according to police reports.

After that night, the girls apparently called Ebberts and invited him over again. There were subsequent sexual encounters at the grandparents' home and at Ebberts' home in Funkstown, police reports showed.

The incidents came to light in April.

Following the pre-sentence investigation I will have additional information for the completion of the ineligible volunteer record sheet.



You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse or cancel registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not meet the high standards of membership which the BSA seeks to provide for american youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA Regional Review Committee, please write to the Region Director within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the Northeast Region, Boy Scouts of America, the decision to deny your registration.

- Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the Regional Director, Northeast Region, Boy Scouts of America. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
