

COMES NOW the plaintiff and for his cause of action against the defendants alleges and states as follows:

- 1. The plaintiff is a resident of Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska and his date of birth is March 6, 1975; the defendant Boys Scouts of America is a non-profit corporation organized pursuant to the laws of Washington D.C. and conducting business in the State of Nebraska through the defendant Boy Scouts of America, Cornhusker Council.
- 2. That in 1986 the plaintiff joined Troop 5 of the Boy Scouts of American Cornhusker Council; that at that time John Fishbach was an assistant scout master for said troop.
- 3. The 15th day of November, 1986 John Fishbach came to plaintiff's home as assistant scoutmaster to work on a merit badge: that during the course of the visit at the plaintiff's house John Fishbach touched the plaintiff's sex organs on that occasion; again in December of 1986 John Fishbach came to the plaintiff's place of residence for the stated purpose of working on a scout merit badge and again touched the plaintiff's sex organs; again in approximately June of 1987 John Fishbach came to the plaintiff's place of

residence for the purpose of working on a scout merit badge and again touched the plaintiff in a like manner.

- 4. That prior to assigning John Fishbach as assistant scoutmaster for the plaintiff's troop the defendant was aware that John Fishbach had in the past had inappropriate sexual contact with boys in a scouting troop; that despite this knowledge the defendant Cornhusker Counsel, pursuant to the policies of the Boy Scouts of America, reassigned John Fishbach to another scouting troop and failed to protect the plaintiff against John Fishbach.
- 5. That at all times mentioned herein the defendants were aware of the likelihood that John Fishbach would engage in sexual contact with a minor boy.
- 6. As a result of the breach of the defendants' duty to protect the plaintiff against the sexual contact of John Fishbach, the plaintiff has suffered emotional upset and humiliation and has been forced to undergo counseling in an attempt to minimize the impact of the defendant's negligence. The plaintiff has incurred the costs of counseling in the amount of \$75.00.

WHEREFORE the plaintiff prays for judgment against the defendants in the amount of \$75.00 and general damages as allowed by law and costs of this action.

# Child assault charges dropped; ex-Scout leader to be evaluated

The Lancaster County attorney's office has dismissed two charges against former assistant Boy Scout leader John Fischbach, who had been accused of fondling an 11-year-old Scout.

Fischbach, 33, 520 Eldora Lane, is to undergo a psychological evaluation as part of an agreement filed Tuesday in Lancaster County District Court. Fischbach also agreed to complete counseling if that is recommended.

Fischbach had been charged with two counts of sexual assault of a child.

Fischbach was arrested March 30 and charged with fondling an 11-year-old Boy Scout. The boy told authorities that Fischbach fondled him in January 1987 and in March 1987 when Fischbach came to the boy's residence to help him with

Scouting activities.

The boy told his father about the alleged assaults in March, police said.

Jim Mowbray, Fischbach's attorney, said his client maintains that he is innocent of the charges. Mowbray said agreements, such as the one Fischbach entered, are not uncommon when there is a question about whether the county attorney's office can prove the charges.

Rather than having both sides risk losing at a trial, such an agreement allows the state to address the problem if there is one, especially with people likely to have contact with children.

Fischbach, who was removed from his Boy Scout duties when charges were filed, does not plan to resume work as an assistant leader. Mowbray said.

## of sex assault of boy, 11

John E. Fischbach, 33, of 520 Eldora Lane was arraigned Thursday in Lancaster County Court on two felony charges of having sexual contact with a child.

The charges and arrest warrant documents filed in court alleged that in January and March of 1987, Fischbach had sexual contact with an 11-year-old boy he was supervising as an assistant Boy Scout leader.

According to the warrant documents, both incidents occurred at the boy's home while Fischbach and the boy were discussing Scouting activities. In both incidents, Fischbach was alleged to have rubbed the boy's genitals while both he and the boy were clothed.

On March 27 of this year the boy's father overheard a telephone conversation, during which the boy said that he intended to quit Scouting. The boy reported the incidents to his father after the man asked why he intended to quit, the warrant documents stated.

After discussing the incidents, the boy's father telephoned police.

Fischbach was released from custody Thursday after posting 10 percent of a \$10,000 bond set by Judge James Foster.

Foster ordered as a condition of the bond that Fischbach have no contact with the boy alleged to have been the victim of the sexual assaults, and to have no unsupervised contact with any child younger than 16.

Jerry Houchens, executive director of the Cornhusker Council of the Boy Scouts of America, said Fischbach was removed from his volunteer duties with the Scouts after council officials learned of the charges against him. Houchin said Fischbach could appeal the removal if he is acquitted of the charges.

Houchens said the Boy Scouts had, in recent years, instituted an educational program and adopted screening procedures for volunteer and professional workers, designed to prevent incidents of sexual abuse of children.

### for allegedly fondling boy

An assistant Boy Scout leader in Lincoln was charged Thursday in Lancaster County Court with two counts of sexual assault of a child for allegedly fondling a 12-year-old Scout member.

John E. Fischbach, 520 Eldora Lane, 33, allegedly fondled the boy, who is now 14, on two occasions in January and March 1987.

Fischbach owns a lawn service and thas been an assistant scout leader since 1985, authorities said.

The assaults allegedly occurred at the boy's residence, according to an arrest warrant affidavit filed Wednesday in Lancaster County Court.

In January 1987, Fischbach allegedly fondled the boy when he went to the

boy's residence to discuss troop activities, the arrest warrant said.

About seven weeks later, Fischbach allegedly fondled the boy when he went to his residence to help him with a merit badge, the arrest warrant said.

The boy's father told police that in late summer 1987 his son did not want to return to Boy Scouts, go on outings, camping trips or to meetings, the arrest warrant said.

Despite his reluctance, the boy continued in Boy Scouts, authorities said.

On Monday, after the boy told his mother he was going to quit Boy Scouts, he told his father about the alleged assaults, the arrest warrant said.

Fischbach was arrested Thursday morning at his home and was arraigned Thursday afternoon in county court.

Police said Fischbach has been relieved of his Scouting duties while the charges are pending.

Judge James Foster set Fischbach's bond at \$10,000 with a provision that he be released from jail by posting 10 percent of that amount. Foster also ordered that Fischbach have no contact with the alleged victim or any unsupervised child younger than 16.
