Dear Paul,

I am enclosing a confidential report sheet on Kip E. Later, who was employed as a program director at one of our summer camps.

Kip is currently a student at the Brigham Young University at Provo, in youth leadership preparing to enter the Scouting Profession. He is targeted to graduate in April. I have advised him that he is no longer qualified nor eligible to be involved in Scouting professionally or as a volunteer. He has admitted himself to a hospital and is involved in counseling and therapy to help overcome his sexual problems, and believes that he will be cured and ready for Scouting involvement by April. I have advised him that I was reporting his activities to the National Council and that his name would be placed on a confidential list which would prohibit his further involvement in Scouting.

Kip attempted several times at night to enter a boys sleeping bag, and on one occasion, as you will read from the attached report, succeeded in unzipping the boys pants, but was thwarted in his attempt when the boy woke up and asked him to "knock it off". Kip admitted to me that this was not his first involvement with a male in a sexual attempt, but that he has on two other occasions been caught, neither of them involving activities nor participation in Scouting.

It would be my recommendation that Kip be placed on the confidential file and denied involvement in Scouting at the present and in the future. added to keep the son of the

COUNCIL COMMISSIONER

Report

On Wednesday evening, August 10, 1988, at 10:30 p.m. while assisting with the girls summer camp at Camp in the high Uinta Mountains, council staff member, Nelson Hatch, and also director of Scout Camp came into camp to visit with me about a problem that had taken place at Scout Camp. Nelson told me that his program director, Kip Lattar, who is a BYU student in youth leadership and planning to enter the profession, approximate age 22 years, had attempted to sexually abuse a 14 year Kip is also from a few occasions Kip had during the night unzip sleeping bag with the intent of fondling the young boy. Each time the young boy, either awakened or rolled over, frightening Kip away terminating his intentions. During Tuesday night, August 9, was awakened to find Kip's hand in his sleeping bag, his bag unzipped and his pants unzipped. Apparently nothing else transpired that night. The next day Wednesday, August 10, asked Kip what he was doing with his hand in his sleeping bag, and Kip told him that he had been sexually abused as a child, and was having a very difficult time trying to control his own sexual desires now, and on a few occasions had unzipped bag with the intent of putting his hand into pants. He told that he was taking counseling for this problem and trying to overcome it. He also told that if this was known by the Scouting officials it would probably ruin his plans to enter the Scouting profession and asked not to tell on him.

After thinking over what Kip had said, and what had transpired, related the incident to Nelson Hatch, at which time Nelson pulled Kip from his assignment and told him that this was unacceptable behavior and that he was terminated. Nelson told me that Kip was still in camp, but was staying with until they had a chance to visit with me and determine what further action needed to be taken. I advised Nelson to return to camp and in the morning tell Kip that this was inappropriate and unacceptable behavior and that he was terminated and that I was obligated to notify the Boy Scouts of America as to the reason why he was terminated.

Nelson told me that the young boy, was most upset, not only because of what was attempted on him, but because of his close friendship with Kip and what was happening now to Kip. He stated that they were going to let return home and handle the situation. I advised Nelson to visit with and encourage him to remain in camp and fulfill his responsibility. Where we were assured by both Kip and that no fondling, touching, or anything other than unzipping had taken place that it would be in best interest to stay on and finish his obligation and let Kip handle his situation on his own. At approximately 11:10 p.m. Nelson departed from Piuta, returned to East Fork of the Bear, where he called Steve Luna in Salt Lake, to relay the directive that I had given him.

On Thursday, August 11, Steve Luna advised me that Nelson Hatch had called him from camp and told him that he had released Kip and that was feeling much better about the situation and planned to remain in camp and fulfill his responsibilities.

Friday morning, August 12, Kip later phoned me and asked for an opportunity to visit with me, stating that he was in the Charter Summit Hospital, at in Midyale. He asked if I couldn't come there to visit with him. I agreed to do so prior to my going to camp this date to visit with in about the situation.

Shortly before noon Friday, August 12, I visited with Kip Later at the Charter Summit Hospital. Kip told me that he had a very serious problem and because of child abuse that he had sustained from age 10 and 1/2 to 15, he has had a strong urge to fondle and be involved in sexual relations with other males. He also told me that on two other occasions he had had problems and had received counseling from his religious leaders and from a councilor. The counceling only involved two sessions and he felt was not sufficient to help him overcome the problems that he having. He expressed great sorrow and quilt in the attempt to fondle the but assured me that he had in no way ever touched no done anything beyond unzipping his bag and his pants while he was asleep in his sleeping bag.

Kip was very concerned that because of his actions I would keep him from entering the profession. I assured him that it was not me but his actions that would keep him from being involved further, not only as a professional, but as a volunteer in Scouting. This caused him much concern and he asked if after he finished his treatment at Summit Charter Hospital if we would not erase any quilt that he might have. I told him that we would never know when or if he would be totally free from this type of temptation and did not feel that BSA could take that chance with their young boys. Kip then asked if there was someone of greater authority that he might talk to beyond me. I told him that he could visit with Ed Hughes, Western Region Personnel Director, but not until I had visited with the young boy to make sure that What Kip was telling me was in fact true.

On Friday evening, August 12, I met with the 14 year old boy, at camp and visited with him about what had transpired. He seemed totally in control and was not upset in any way. He told me on several occasions, he had awakened in the middle of the night, to find his sleeping bag unzipped, and on Tuesday, August 9, he had awakened to find his sleeping bag unzipped and Kips hand inside his sleeping bag unzipping his pants. He told Kip at that time to just knock it off and turned over and went back to sleep. The next morning Kip, feeling that he had been discovered tried to lay a quilt trip on telling him that if he would discovered it would ruin his career and his life.

shared this experience and Kips comments with two of the older staff members, and after discussion related the incident to camp director Nelson Hatch.

I asked if he would call his mother and assure her that everything was great, that he was in good shape, but that Kip had a problem and had been released from camp. I felt this was important as Kip's mother and mother were neighbors and very close friends, and mother was sure to hear about from one source or another. At that time called home, but found his mother had not returned from work and would not return until 7:30 that evening. I asked if he would come with Nelson later this evening and make the phone call to his mother and then let Nelson explain what had transpired and that Kip was now in a hospital in Salt Lake undergoing treatment, and would not be involved at any further time in our Scouting program.
